USC

Preseason pred.: 5-3, 7-5 Revision: 5-3, 6-6 (4th)

Fun Fact: Oregon State coach Jerry Pettibone on the difference between conference receiving leaders J.J. Stokes and USC's Johnnie Morton: "Stokes is taller." It would seem as though the Trojans may have killed their bowl hopes in the first game of the season when they were crushed by North Carolina. USC has only lost once in the conference, but the loss to the Tar Heels and Penn State left them at 1-2 before the conference schedule even started. An additional loss to Notre Dame further tarnished the Trojans' record.

But in reality, even if USC loses two of its remaining four games, it will still get a call from a bowl. Unless the Trojans somehow lose three of four games against California, Stanford, Washington and UCLA, they will likely finish within the top four in the league, giving them an automatic berth.

OREGON

Preseason pred.: 4-4, 6-5 Revision: 4-4, 7-4

Fun Fact: Quarterback Danny O'Neil leads the conference in total offense, averaging 290 yards a game. If he continues at that pace he will set the Pac-10 record for total offense in a season.

The Ducks have a big task in front of them. They must play the sixth- and first-ranked defenses in the nation in consecutive weeks: Washington State and Arizona. O'Neil, with the exception of last weekend's six interception performance, has played brilliantly for Oregon.

The Ducks can afford only one more loss this season if they are to have a shot at a bowl bid, but with three games remaining at home against the Cougars, Stanford and Oregon State, Oregon just needs go undefeated at home the rest of the way and hope those ever-popular traveling boosters will draw the eye of a bowl committee.

The rest of the midseason predictions go like this: Washington State will crumble, losing all three of its remaining games. Oregon State and Arizona State will also lose the rest of their games, and Stanford will win one, over the Beavers, for its only conference win of the season.
