lition could be corrected by adding asphalt curbs that would route rainwater to drainage grates and away from the buildings.

Almar Millman, an Amazon resident for more than a year, also said that he believes the University is not considering restoration options.

"They've decided to tear down the buildings, so they've found problems to justify that," he said. "It would be nice to find out what possible options would be. The University is not willing to discuss solutions.

"They're pushing things so fast that we have to use our energy to get them to stop and consider other options." Millman said.
"They've got their blinders on and aren't willing to see anything but what they've set their sights on.

Clean-up participants also seemed hopeful about the petition that a group of tenants filed with the Eugene Historical Review Board requesting that Amazon be declared a historical site. If the request is granted, demolition will be delayed while the buildings' historical significance is documented.

The buildings are all that remains of Vanport, a temporary World War II-era city that was located near Portland, and were moved to Eugene in 1947 to house returning war veterans. At the time, University officials planned to tear down the buildings after 10 years.




