some ideas on that," he said.

Student officials came to Monday's meeting fully backed by the IFC, Student Senate, EMU board and ASUO Executive, which decided last week not to follow the administration-amended Clark Document.

ASUO President Eric Bowen said last week that he would argue against the amendment all the way to the Oregon State Board of Higher Education. He didn't need to.

"I was pretty surprised," said Jay Forsythe, communications coordinator for the ASUO, who expected Monday to be the start of a long battle. "Eric did a great job and showed the administration that he can rally the student organizations and get support."

The amendment the ASUO hopes to devise would minimize incidental fee hikes, block any possibility for the IFC to micro-manage the EMU board budget and keep the IFC as the overseeing body for all

fee-funded groups, Forsythe said.

"This is the same line that we've kept with before," he said.

Forsyth said the ASUO already has a rough plan that it will be finalizing over the next several months.

The University circulated its amendment to student officials Oct. 29, just one business day before the Nov. 1 deadline mandated by the Clark Document.

ASUO officials argued ever since receiving the amendment that they didn't receive enough time for comment. The administration, on the other hand, has said discussion ended last May when University President Myles Brand directed Moseley and several other officials to write a proposal changing the IFC rules.

Keeping the IFC from direct management of the EMU board budget was the chief concern pushing the administration to change the IFC rules, Moseley said.
