

Volleyball team hopes it saved best for last

Three matches remain in the Oregon volleyball team's season. It hopes it has saved the best for last.

The Ducks, 1-14 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 4-19 for the season, play home matches against Stanford and California this weekend. Despite its lack of success against conference opponents, head coach Gerry Gregory said his team has good chances for wins against two of its last three opponents, California and Oregon State.

"Those are two teams that we have no excuse for if we lose. We need to go out there and compete hard," Gregory said.

Oregon faces defending national champion Stanford Friday night at 7:05. Stanford, 10-4 in the Pac-10, is ranked sixth nationally and has been ranked as high as second this season. Gregory said the Cardinal is a young but very athletic and talented team.

The Ducks hope that swing hitter LaReina Woods, fourth in the conference in digs with a 3.77 average, will be at full strength for the match. An ankle injury sustained last weekend slowed

down Woods in Oregon's last two matches.

"LaReina hasn't had any jumping practice until today," Gregory said Thursday. "She looked pretty good, but we'll have to see how she feels tomorrow."

Oregon plays California, 3-12 in the Pac-10, Saturday night at 7:05. The first meeting between the two teams was a five-game battle, with California winning the fifth game 19-17.

"Against California, we match up very evenly," Gregory said. "There's no physical superiority on either side. It's a winnable match for us, and we'll consider ourselves favorites going in."

The Ducks have lost several close matches in recent weeks. Gregory said the team has spent time in practice this week working on starting games faster.

The object is to win games more easily, and more importantly, to avoid having to come from behind, especially when matches go to five games.

"We were working on the first five points of the game," Gregory said. "We're hoping that will help us if we get to rally scoring" in the fifth game, he said.

CARLTON & WILBERTA SAVAGE VISITING PROFESSORSHIP IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND PEACE

The committee that selects the distinguished Carlton Raymond and Wilberta Ripley Savage Professor in International Relations and Peace is pleased to announce an opening for a Graduate Teaching Fellow (GTF) to assist the 1993-94 professor, Nelly Arvelo-Jiménez. Arvelo-Jiménez is currently senior anthropologist at the Instituto Venezolano De Investigaciones Cientificas, Venezuela's equivalent of the U.S.'s National Science Foundation. She has been active in advocacy for the rights of indigenous peoples of Latin America. She holds a PhD from Cornell University and has lectured widely throughout Latin American and the United States.

The GTF will assist Arvelo-Jiménez in teaching two courses during the spring term of 1994, consisting of a large undergraduate class and a smaller graduate seminar. The GTF will also work with the Savage Professorship Committee and its chair during winter term 1994 in preparing for Arvelo-Jiménez's teaching during the spring. The GTF position may be appointed at .20 FTE for the winter, .40 for the spring, and a possible .20 for the summer.

To qualify, candidates should be enrolled as a full-time graduate student at the University of Oregon in a field related to Arvelo-Jiménez's expertise; possess a strong interest in issues related to human rights and indigenous people; and demonstrate strong cross-cultural communication, organization, and writing skills. Knowledge of Spanish is desirable. Applicants should submit a current vita, two letters of reference, and a short essay indicating why they would like to work with Nelly Arvelo-Jiménez to the Office of International Affairs, 221 Johnson Hall (attention Lynn Buffing, 346-2167) no later than 5:00 p.m. on November 30, 1993.
