the Pac-10 schools, and you have very good coaches at every school," he said.

UCLA, 24-1 for the season and ranked first nationally, clinched the Pac-10 title with a sweep of Washington and Washington State last weekend. The Bruins won one of 24 automatic bids to the NCAA tournament.

The 23 remaining spots in the tournament are at-large bids, meaning the teams will be selected by a committee. Stanford, second in the Pac-10 and ranked sixth in the nation; Arizona State, third in the Pac-10 and 11th in the nation; USC, ranked 13th; and Arizona, ranked 15th; all appear headed for the playoffs.

Sixth-place Washington State and seventh-place Oregon State could finish in a tie for sixth place at 8-10 in the conference if the Cougars are swept by the Arizona schools and the Beavers beat Oregon this weekend. The two teams split their head-to-head matches, but Washington

State owns a better record on the season.

If history is any indication, Pac-10 schools will again be a force in postseason play. Last season, UCLA won the conference championship, but it was Stanford that captured the NCAA title.

"Every night in the Pac-10 is a match of playoff intensity," Mozzochi said.

"The Pac-10 prepares its teams with better competition top to bottom than any other conference around. Most conferences don't usually play two top-25 teams in the same weekend, and we do that every weekend," he said.

All the same, few teams around the nation would probably shy away from a match with the 4-21 Ducks. Is Mozzochi surprised that one of the teams he said ranks among the top 40 nationally is only 1-16 in the conference this season?

"I am surprised, because they're a much better team than their record," he said. "The flip side of that is I'm not shocked because the conference is so tough this year."

Duck X-country teams selected for nationals

The Oregon men's and women's cross country teams will both be represented in the NCAA Cross Country Championships Monday in Bethlehem, Pa.

Chick Hislop, chairman of the NCAA cross country subcommittee, said the Ducks were selected as at-large teams for the NCAA appearances after finishing third in the District VIII meet last Saturday.

The women's squad was one of six teams added to the NCAA field, but the men's team survived a much closer scrutiny as just three at-large berths were awarded.

"I'm very pleased for our runners," men's coach Bill Dellinger said. "They ran well at the district meet, and I'm happy the NCAA noticed."

The invitation for the women's team was expected.

The Ducks lost to four district champions (Michigan, Arkansas, Brigham Young and Arizona) during the season and had beaten Nebraska, second in District V, and Cornell, another at-large selection, and Arizona throughout the year.

In addition to Oregon, Cornell, Georgetown, Clemson, Virginia, North Carolina and Wisconsin were added to the NCAA women's field.

The men were joined by Penn State and Wisconsin as the at-large teams.

The meet will begin at 8 a.m. Monday with the men's race, followed by the women's race at 9:15 a.m.

The women were led in the district meet by freshman Milena Glusac, who finished sixth, followed by Melody Fairchild, who finished ninth. The men were led by Karl Keska, who took seventh overall.

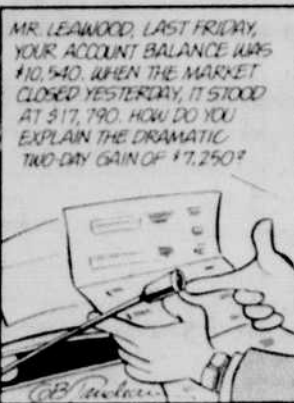
