

# Runners end year well at NCAAs

Freshman Milena Glusac capped a solid season with a 12th-place finish, leading the women's cross country team to an eighth-place finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championships in Bethlehem, Pa., Monday.

Glusac was the top freshman finisher in the field, and Alabama's Becki Wells was the second.

The women's team, which finished third at the District VIII meet a week ago, defeated the other two qualifiers from its dis-

trict — Stanford and Arizona — as Villanova ran away with the race, finishing with 66 points, just five points ahead of second-place Arkansas.

The men's team also snuck into the NCAAs with a third-place finish at district, but the men did not fare as well in Pennsylvania, taking 15th.

Last year, the men finished eighth at the national meet, and this year they entered the NCAAs ranked 15th in the country.

The Ducks' top finisher was Tracy Hollister, who finished 59th. Karl Keska took 74th, Rick Cantwell was right behind at 77th, and John Dimoff took 94th.

Jason Humble took 124th overall at the meet, and Scott Nicholas finished 179th.

Arkansas took the men's title, blowing away the field and finishing 120 points ahead of second-place Brigham Young.

Pacific-10 Conference foes Washington finished eighth in

the team standings, 80 places ahead of the Ducks. The Portland Pilots also fared well, taking 12th in the team standings, 16 places ahead of Oregon.

Jenna Carlson ran by far her best race of the season for the women, and probably her career, as she took 23rd overall for Oregon. The Ducks' Melody Fairchild, who had established herself as the No. 2 scorer over the last half of the season, settled in as the third Oregon scorer, taking 71st overall.

Oregon sophomore Niamh Zwagerman finished fourth for the Ducks, taking 83rd overall, and Duck Joni Wareham was 127th overall and fifth for Oregon.

Oregon's Christie Engesser and Jen Doyle respectively finished 170th and 181st overall.

The Ducks were the top-finishing Pac-10 team in the race. Other Pac-10 teams finishing high were Stanford, at 11th, and Arizona, right behind in 12th place.
