Men's tennis aces foes in Hawaii

The Oregon men's tennis team is back in the continental United States, but not before picking up a pair of wins in Hawaii last weekend.

The Ducks shut out Hawaii Pacific 7-0 Thursday before picking up a 6.5-0.5 win over Chaminade Friday. Oregon split four games in the Aloha State last week and now prepares for the Pacific-10 Conference Indoor Championships in Seattle Jan. 14-17.

The Ducks had little problem with either Hawaii Pacific or Chaminade, winning all but one set. Lee Kirner played No. 1 for the Ducks, and after winning by default in his first match, Kirner breezed past Chaminade's Chris Makrud 6-0, 6-1.

Josh Prager, Oregon's No. 2 player in both matches, got a tough test from Hawaii Pacific's Matthias Buehl before winning 6-4, 7-5. It didn't

get any easier for Prager against Chaminade, but he prevailed over Chad Cooley, 7-6, 6-3.

Christian Oelke beat Hawaii Pacific's Luca Ceceatrelli, 6-2, 6-3, before disposing of Chaminade's Takashi Kawachi, 6-0, 6-3. Oregon's biggest winner was Jeff Strong, who combined to beat his two opponents 24-1 in four sets. Strong beat Hawaii Pacific's Anders Backstrand 6-1, 6-0, before beating Ray Carvalho of Chaminade 6-0, 6-0.

Mike Goldstein also swept his two matches, and Matt Cobo beat Hawaii Pacific's Kevin Leong 6-1, 6-3, before tying Chaminade's Danny Vu, 7-6, 3-6.

In doubles action, Kirner and Oelke, Oregon's No. 1 team, and Prager and Cobo, Oregon's No. 2 team, both beat their Hawaii Pacific opponents 8-1 and their Chaminade foes 8-3. Goldstein and Strong cruised to consecutive victories as well.

Wrestling hopes to hit the Las Vegas jackpot

The Oregon wrestling team travels to Las Vegas, Nev., this weekend to compete in the Las Vegas Invitational Friday and Saturday.

The Ducks are coming off their first dual meet victory of the year, 28-20 over Stanford on Saturday. This weekend's meet will be Oregon's toughest test so far this year and may be the toughest it faces all season.

"This is the toughest tournament in the country next to the NCAA," Oregon wrestling coach Ron Finley said.

Leading the way for the Ducks are 118-pound sophomore Kevin Roberts and junior Cory Sonnen at 142 pounds. Roberts and Sonnen are each 4-0 this year and are ranked 12th and 15th national-

ly in their weight classes, respectively. Heavyweight Chris Anderson, also ranked 12th in the country, is 3-1, including a pinning of Stanford's Chris Serjak Saturday to clinch the Duck victory.

Junior Jeff McCoy (190 pounds) is off to a 3-0 start after winning a 10-0 major decision over Bryan Vaniman of Stanford Saturday. Oregon's Peter Stayner (158) and Clint Messner (177) will take their 4-1 and 3-1 records, respectively, into action as well this weekend.

Sophomore James Stephens (0-0 this year at 126 pounds), 150-pound freshman Scott Norton (2-2) and 167-pound junior Tom Glenn (3-2), will also compete for the Ducks. In addition, either Pat Hirai (1-1) or Tim Kitchen (1-1) will wrestle for the Ducks at 134 pounds.

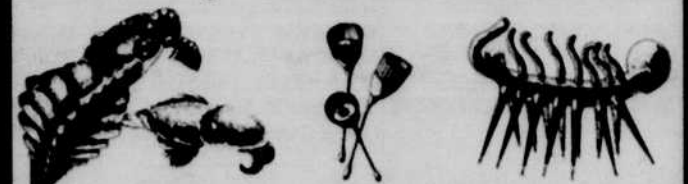
