12 Ducks honored for academics

Oregon placed a dozen student-athletes on the Pacific-10 Conference all-academic team during the fall, including five players on first teams.

Three members of the Oregon football team's defensive squad

made the Pac-10's first team. Linebacker Bryon Rockwell, defensive lineman Mark Slymen and safety Jeff Sherman were all honored by the conference.

Sherman, a junior majoring in exercise and movement science, had 26 tackles and three pass deflections for the 5-6 Ducks in


1993. Slymen, a junior management major, had 12 tackles and two sacks before his season was cut short after seven games due to injury. Rockwell, a senior general business major, returned from injury last year to record 19 tackles, including seven in the season-ending 15-14 loss to Ore-

The Oregon men's and women's cross country teams had three team members each named to the all-academic team. Junior Jenna Carlson, a psychology major with a 3.33 GPA, was named to the first team, while teammates Jill Callero and Niamh Zwagerman made second-team. Callero carries a 3.56 GPA in Exercise and Movement Science, and Zwagerman is a Romance Languages major with a 3.57 GPA.

Senior John Dimoff represented the Oregon men's team on the first team, with a 3.50 GPA in economics. Redshirt freshman Rick Cantwell was selected to the second team after earning a 3.55 GPA while undecided on major. Sophomore Tim Mahon, a chemistry major with a 3.28 GPA, was an honorable mention.

The volleyball team also had three players honored by the conference, led by senior Nicole Hedberg, who has a 3.15 GPA in fine and applied arts. Junior Angee Henderson, a biology major with a 3.58 GPA, and redshirt freshman Amy McNeel, a psychology major with a 3.02 GPA, were both named honor-

To be eligible for these teams, student-athlete must be a starter or prominent reserve with a GPA above 3.0.



Kaufman to stay at UW for his senior season

SEATTLE (AP) - The Washington Huskies will have Napoleon Kaufman back next season

Just 440 yards from becoming the all-time rusher in the Huskies' history, the 5-foot-9 scatback announced Monday that he has decided to stay in Seattle for his senior season.

Kaufman, 20, made his announcement at a campus news conference after the NFL last Thursday told him where he was projected to be picked in April's NFL draft.

Kaufman didn't get the right projection.

Kaufman refused Monday to discuss what he'd learned from the NFL. But he said, "I feel that I'm a first-round pick. Obviously, I have a lot of room to improve, but I feel I can run with the best of them.

On Monday, Washington coach Jim Lambright said he didn't know what the NFL had said about Kaufman's prospects.

There had been speculation that Kaufman could be chosen as late as the third or fourth round.

As a third-round pick this year, the 179-pound Kaufman probably could have made about \$250,000 as an NFL return specialist, a nickel wide receiver and a spot running back.

Kaufman hopes to enhance his draft status by playing his final season at Washington. But he knows he's still going to be a first-round longshot because of his size.

"I'm not going to get any bigger," he said. "I'm not going to get (to) 6 feet in a year and I'm not going to be 200 pounds.'

Kaufman's status was uncertain after the Huskies finished their 1993 season with a victory over Washington State Nov. 20.

Kaufman rushed for a school single-season record 1,299 yards as a junior, helping the Huskies post a 7-4 record in their first of two years on Pac-10 probation for breaking NCAA rules.

Because Washington has been banned from going to a bowl game for two consecutive seasons and because of Kaufman's outstanding junior season, he was expected to enter the draft early. Kaufman went to the Rose Bowl as a true freshman and sophomore.

Kaufman's decision to stay left Lambright optimistic about the 1994 season. Washington will open next season against Southern Cal, Ohio State, Miami and UCLA.

"We just got the No. 1 recruit of the season," Lam-bright said. "It's a lot easier to coach with a back who makes your linemen look good." With 2,651 yards in three seasons, Kaufman is a sure bet to break the Washington career rushing record of 3,091 yards set by Joe Steele from 1976 through

Kaufman said he planned to take out an insurance policy, under NCAA rules, in case he gets hurt next season.


