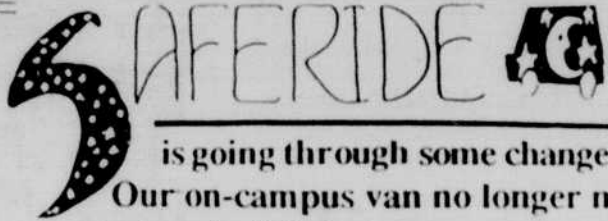

"Community response has indicated that they are encouraged, that it is an upbeat way to patrol," Zahar said. He smiles. "It's great exercise, too."

The biggest problem with a bicycle patrol program seems to be acquiring the funds to start it up. Zahar would like to see a dedicated program of full-time bike officers in Eugene, but at the moment the department is able to put out bike officers only when there is extra staffing.

Zahar said a minimum number of officers must always be on duty. Bike officers count as part of this minimum, but only as half an officer because officers on bicycles are unable to transport people they have arrested. In an already overworked department, it's hard to make room for officers on bicycles.

"We're doing as much as we

can with the resources we've got," Zahar said.

Once an officer decides he wants to patrol on a bike, he has to learn special techniques for riding the bike, including mounting and dismounting it quickly. Bicycle officers also need special uniforms, such as looser pants that are more practical for bike riding and warm uniforms for winter weather.

The police bikes come with state-of-the-art equipment, with features such as high-intensity headlights that are like car headlights. Zahar said the bicycles the EPD uses are close to the best you can buy. He said they are more durable than a mountain bike, which they need to be for the use they get, and rarely need repairs.

"I personally commute on a Raleigh," Zahar said. "My bike is one step down from a police bike. I never have any problems breaking down."
