# Wrestlers win once, lose twice over weekend

The Oregon wrestling team defeated San Francisco State Friday night but dropped a pair of matches to ranked teams during the weekend.

Oregon opened the weekend with a 24-10 loss to 10th-ranked Fresno State Friday. Sophomore Kevin Roberts got the night off to a good start with a major decision over Fresno State's Eric LeGarreta, but the Bulldogs won the next four matches to take a 12-4 lead and they never trailed

Oregon got victories from Peter Stavner at 158 pounds and leff McCoy at 190 pounds, but McCoy's victory was costly because he injured his knee and was unable to wrestle the rest of the weekend.

Oregon got its only win of the weekend in style, blowing away San Francisco State 34-7 in Friday's nightcap. Oregon took a 22-0 lead with wins in the first six matches and lost only two of the 10 matches.

Saturday night's matchup with Cal-State Bakersfield was one of streaks, and the 21st-

ranked Road Runners were able to get the victory with the final streak. Oregon's Roberts got the Ducks off to another good start at 118 pounds with a decision over Bobby Soto of Bakersfield, giving Oregon a 3-0 lead.

Oregon built a 16-3 lead with wins in five of six matches, including a 12-1 major decision by Cory Sonnen over Jeff Heberle at 142 pounds. Things were looking good for the Ducks, but Bakersfield was able to win the last four matches, including two by pins, to take the match 21-16.

Cal-State Bakersfield's Dan Corpstein pinned Oregon's Tom

Glenn at 167 pounds, and Jassen Froehlich did the same to Oregon's Mike Bratland, who was filling in for McCoy at 190 pounds. Bakersfield clinched the win when heavyweight Kevin Langley won a 4-1 decision over Oregon's Chris Ander-

"I'm really disappointed that the guys at the lower weights did such a good job to build up the lead, and we just couldn't hang on to it," Oregon coach Ron Finley said. "We were clearly outgunned at 190 with McCoy having hurt his knee last
