their budgets would be less of a burden on the committee members.

"We don't have the time now to look at all the budgets before the budget hearing meetings," Lyons said, concerned about the work load. "On the night we hear a budget request, we are usually looking at (the request) for the first time."

Others attending the meeting suggested that since the budgets for the EMU and the Athletic Department are being controlled by separate subcommittees, there would be less work for the program subcommittee anyway.

Because of the number of ASUO recognized programs, the loss of only those two budgets would do little for the workload of the program subcommittee, Lyons said.

At that point, a member of the Student Senate suggested that maybe it's time programs offering similar services join forces under an umbrella group that would divide budget money.

Cheryl Hunter, the ASUO's executive coordinator said that such a plan could cause friction between the ASUO executive committee and the individual programs.

But, Eric Bowen, ASUO president, could have its benefits.

For instance, the numerous organizations now representing Law School students could combine their budgets to bring higher quality to their programs, like hiring fewer, higher quality speakers instead of many, lower quality speakers, he said.

Of the five elected members, the group decided three should be elected for two year terms and two for one year terms.

A system like this would allow for greater continuity in the subcommittee from year to year.

The group originally considered that four positions should be for two years, but later withdrew the suggestion because such a system could blackball older students.

Bowen also suggested that it was a bad idea because it might force students interested in running for just a one year spot to run for the two year seats with the intention of quitting after the first year.

The additional two seats on the subcommittee will both be appointed, one by the ASUO president and the other by the Programs Council.
