

Washington drunken drivers may face stiffer laws

OLYMPIA (AP) — Motorists who repeatedly drive drunk will face tougher penalties under a package of bills being considered by Washington lawmakers.

"The Omnibus Anti-Drunken Driving Act is a vital reform of our law," Seattle City Attorney Mark Sidran told the Senate Committee on Law & Justice Wednesday.

Sidran was joined by a representative of Mothers Against Drunk Driving and others in testifying in favor of the bills proposed by Sen. Adam Smith, D-Kent.

But a Renton District Court judge told the panel the legislation would add to already overburdened court dockets in King, Pierce and Snohomish counties.

"The net result is that we still don't have the resources in these three counties," said Judge Robert McBeth, representing the Washington State District and Municipal Court Judges Association.

A provision of one of the bills would make a third drunken-driving offense a felony. The package also would reduce the allowable blood-alcohol content for motorists statewide from .10 to .08. Several communities already use the lower limit.

Another key component of the legislation is a provision for automatic 90-day license suspensions for motorists who fail or refuse to take a breath test. The first-offense suspension would take effect 30

days after the person was stopped or after an administrative hearing before the Department of Licensing. The department has estimated the cost of providing the hearings statewide at more than \$10 million for the state's two-year budget period.

Currently, motorists who fail a breath test are allowed to keep their licenses until every appeal and court proceeding has been resolved, which gives offenders an incentive to drag the process out, Sidran said.

A recent study found that it took an average of four months for someone stopped for drunken driving to complete the process, Sidran said. He said the new pro-

cedure would save lives and money by easing the burden on the courts.

McBeth disagreed.

If the automatic license suspension is put in place, "I submit that all you will have created is a dual system," he said.

Motorists accused of drunken driving still would have to face trial on that charge, McBeth said.

McBeth said he is in favor of other parts of the proposed package, but thinks the \$10 million would be better spent directly on relieving the burden in the court system.

He said that even if the state finds quicker ways to strip drunken drivers of their licenses, it won't stop them from driving.
