ond half scoring 14 points and grabbing eight rebounds during the second 20 minutes.

Harris kept the Cougars close in the first half scoring 16 points, and kept it up in the second half scoring 18 points to finish with 34 on 11 of 19 shooting from the field and 11 of 11 from the free throw line.

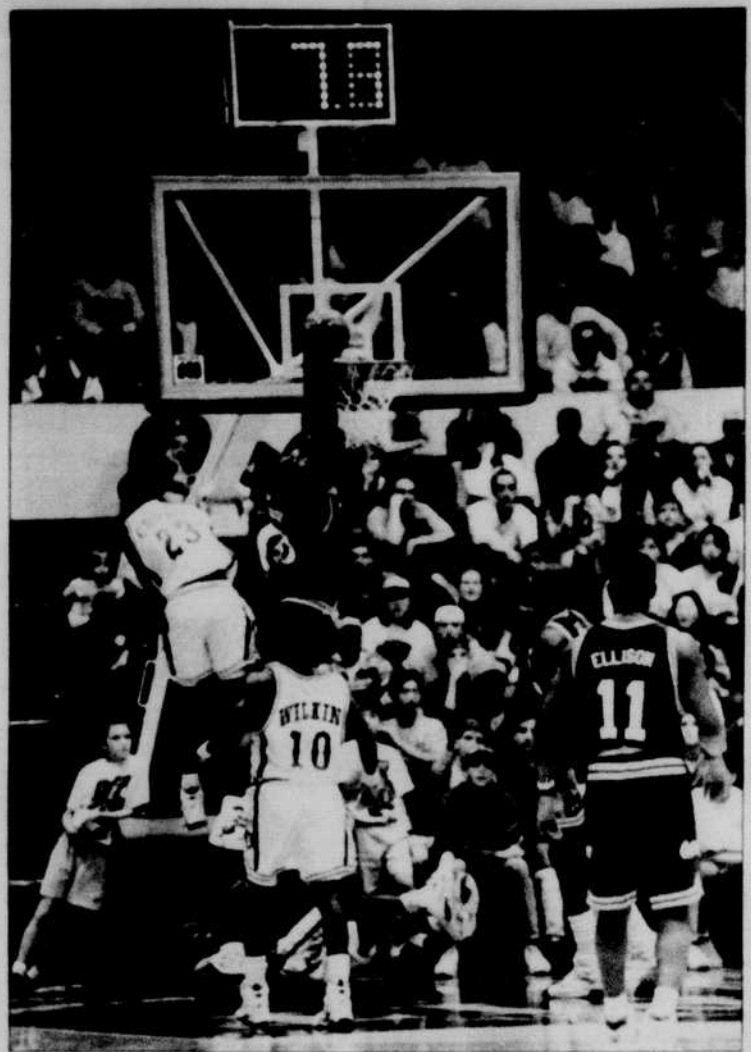
Oregon played quite possibly its best half of basketball all season in the first half. At halftime, the Ducks were shooting 55 percent from the field, had nine assists — Oregon's Pac-10 average coming into the game was 9.3 — and were outrebounding the Cougars 25-10.

"We gave a great effort in the first half," Oregon head coach Jerry Green said. "I thought we played about as hard in that half as we had all year."

For the game, Oregon managed to outrebound the Cougars 48-28, but shot only 29 percent in the second half to finish at 43 percent.

Williams led the Ducks with 21 points, Wilkins added 19 with six assists (five in the first half), but committed eight turnovers.

Oregon will face Washington Saturday in McArthur Court at 7 p.m.

Hockey looks for first win at home

The Oregon hockey team is hoping to pick up its first two victories of the young season when it continues its home stand this weekend against visiting Puget Sound.

Last week, the Ducks were a very offensive team, scoring six goals after eight assists against Washington. The Ducks' downfall came from their lack of covering players and goaltending. The Huskies scored seven goals, but only one came on a power play opportunity.

"In our first game, people seemed to be nervous and afraid to help out on defense because they didn't want to get blamed," said Mark Adams, a junior transfer from the Air Force Academy. Adams scored three goals in the two games for the Ducks.

"As a team for the first week, we were OK," Oregon head coach Paul Rutherford said his team gave a solid effort and keyed in on hockey but still has room for improvement.

"We need to play much stronger at our end," Rutherford said. "We need to capitalize on opportunities, communicate and support each other more."

This is the first year Puget Sound has organized a hockey team, so the Ducks are hoping to take it to them.

Face-off for the first game is at 4:45 p.m. Saturday, followed by the second game at 11 a.m. Sunday at Lane County Ice Arena.

Oregon begins its trip with a match against the Cougars (1-2). The Ducks have defeated Brigham Young six straight times since 1988. One night later, the Ducks travel to Boise to meet the Broncos (1-2), a team Oregon has beaten in six of their last seven meetings.

Oregon's record in dual meets dropped to 4-4 after going 1-2 during last weekend's home stand. The Ducks' hottest wrestler this year is 118-pounder Kevin Roberts, who racked up a 19-3 record, including 7-1 in dual meets. Roberts leads the team with 29 points.

The Oregon women's tennis team opens its season today at the Pacific-10 Conference Indoor tournament, which runs through Sunday. The Ducks are coming off a sensational 24-5 season last year — the best in school history.

Oregon returns a lot of talent from last year's team. But with only eight players on the squad, depth is a question. Six letter winners return for the Ducks, including seniors Cynthia Armstrong, Krissy Barger and co-captains Jackie DeFord and Sherry Fairgrieve. Also returning are sophomore Elise Adams and junior Kara Yoshida, who won 25 and 18 matches respectively last year.
