

Men's tennis continues win streak

The Oregon men's tennis team beat Cal-Santa Cruz Saturday night in Boise.

The 5-2 win improves the Ducks' record to 5-3 and gives them a four-game winning streak dating back to the fall season.

Oregon's victory did not come easy, though, as the Ducks dropped their first three

doubles matches before beginning singles play. Oregon regrouped and came back strong to take five of the six singles matches.

"It was probably one of the better-played matches we've had all year. Santa Cruz is a good team," coach Buzz Summers said.

Santa Cruz lost in the final

round of the NCAA Division III Championships last year.

Oregon winners include Lee Kirner, Josh Prager, Mike Goldstein, John DeVorss and Dara Partovi.

The team pulled its record over .500 for the first time this year with a 5-2 win over Montana State in Boise Friday.

Ducks close again; lose at ASU, 84-78

Once again, the men's basketball team had an opportunity to get an important Pacific-10 Conference road win, but eventually lost 84-78 to Arizona State Saturday in Tempe.

The Ducks are now 2-5 in the Pac-10, and all five of those losses were potential victories if Oregon just would have taken advantage of its opportunities.

Instead, Oregon is still losing ... just not by as many points as the Ducks did last season.

The Ducks still haven't won a Pac-10 game on the road in 26 games.

Saturday, Oregon got off to a terrible start as the Sun Devils built a 29-11 lead early, but the Ducks came back behind back-to-back three-pointers by Orlando Williams and Jordy Lyden, and suddenly Oregon trailed 29-21.

The Ducks then ended the half with an 8-2 run and trailed 39-35 at halftime. More important was the fact that Sun Devil long-range gunner Stevin Smith suffered an ankle sprain and it was questionable whether he would return. Smith did return, but only scored 13 points for the game.

Oregon came out in the second half and had numerous chances to cut into the Sun Devil lead. The Ducks trailed 52-48 midway through the first half, and had numerous opportunities to get closer as Arizona State couldn't buy a hoop. However, the Ducks couldn't either, failing to score on five straight possessions.

Oregon still managed to stay close and got within three at 69-66 with about five minutes left in the game, but the Ducks went scoreless for their next three possessions, and the Sun Devils took a 10-point lead.

The Ducks had a slim hope in the closing seconds trailing by only five with 30 seconds left, but missed numerous three-point attempts.

Williams led the Ducks with 16 points, including four three-pointers, and Darryl Parker added 14 points before fouling out. Jeff Potter had 13, and Kenya Wilkins had 12 points and a career-high 11 assists.

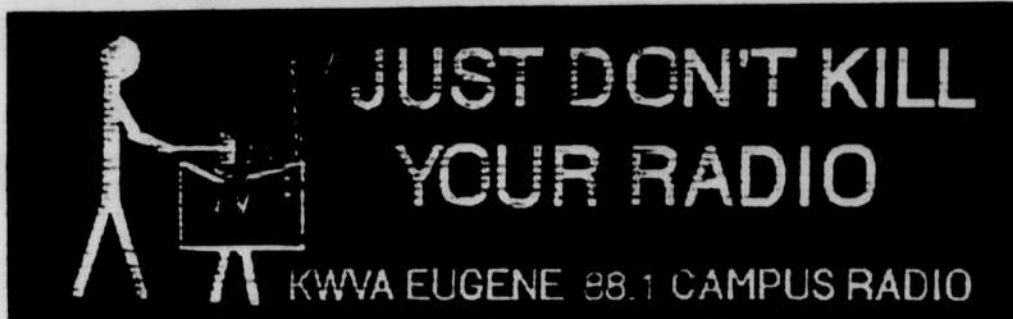
Ron Riley led all scorers with 21 as all Sun Devil starters scored in double figures.
