sacred and wanted to protect.

Deur informed port officials of a federal law that mandates that tribes must have a say in how their land is used, and then documented the tribe's wish to preserve and maintain the land, which became a public record. About a month later, port officials announced they would stop their plans for development.

The project "showed me that I could have an impact on real problems," said Deur, who later returned to teach geography at the institute.

Medler said the program has changed academic careers and has solidified the interests of the participants. The experience also has allowed students to get jobs in areas such as land-use planning and cartography skills that students have learned at the institute, he

Although some students who want to study in the program cannot because they must stay in Eugene to take required courses, there is a lot of discussion about integrating the program into the undergraduate curriculum, Deur

University tuition and financial aid are transferable to the program, and room and board costs \$125 a week. Some student employment, including work study, is avail-
