the 5:33 mark of the first period, after receiving a pass from Adams, Clendenin took it in and scored on a wrist shot. At the end of the first period, the score was 2-1 as the Vandals scored late in the period.

The Vandals, still riding high after their first goal, picked up another goal by tapping the puck past a diving Densmore at the 11:48 mark of the second period to tie the game 2-2. For the next 11 minutes, the two teams battled back and forth to take the lead. In one instance, Densmore's stick was knocked away from him, but he still came up with three saves in a row.

With less than one minute left in the period, Clendenin picked up his second goal. The Ducks were taking a flourish of shots and Clendenin was there to slap

the puck home off of an Adams' shot that rang off the crossbar.

For the rest of the game, the Ducks were in control, and with six minutes left in the game, Clendenin picked up his first-ever hat trick.

"I think it was the new jerseys," Clendenin said jokingly.

In the second game, Idaho was looking for revenge as the Vandals went out to a 2-0 lead into the middle of the second period. After they went ahead 2-0, the Ducks received their wake-up call.

Oregon started to become more aggressive and get more opportunities. Within 30 seconds of the Vandals' second goal, the Ducks had put one in the back of their opponents' net.

Adams received a pass from Oregon forward Seth Prouser, who had two assists the night before, and flipped the puck into the right side of the net. For the remainder of the period, the Ducks were on the offensive. Adams scored again along with Oregon forward Steve Melkerson to take a 3-2 lead going into the final period.

In the third period, the Vandals answered back. At the 16:25 mark, Idaho's Bill Campbell tipped the puck through the five hole of Bahls. Adams, just one goal short of the hat trick, was not to be denied. Adams got all alone on the right side and fired the howitzer into the goal.

Once again, though, the Vandals answered. With five minutes remaining, Idaho's Scott Squires had tied the game at 4-4, and that was how it would end.

Now that the Ducks have a win under their belt, they're hoping to close in on a winning record as they travel to California to face off against Stanford, California and San Jose State in the coming week.
