

# Ducks almost beat Stanford, lose by 2

Brevin Knight's short bank-shot with one second left allowed Stanford to survive an 18-point second-half Oregon comeback and gave the Cardinal a 69-67 win Thursday night at McArthur Court.

Oregon guard Orlando

Williams had tied the game 20 seconds earlier when his three-pointer went through the net and sent a crowd of more than 5,800 into a wild frenzy.

Following a Stanford timeout, Knight took the inbound pass, and drove to the hoop before lofting up a high-bank shot that went through the hoop and ended a quest for one of the greatest

comebacks in recent Oregon history.

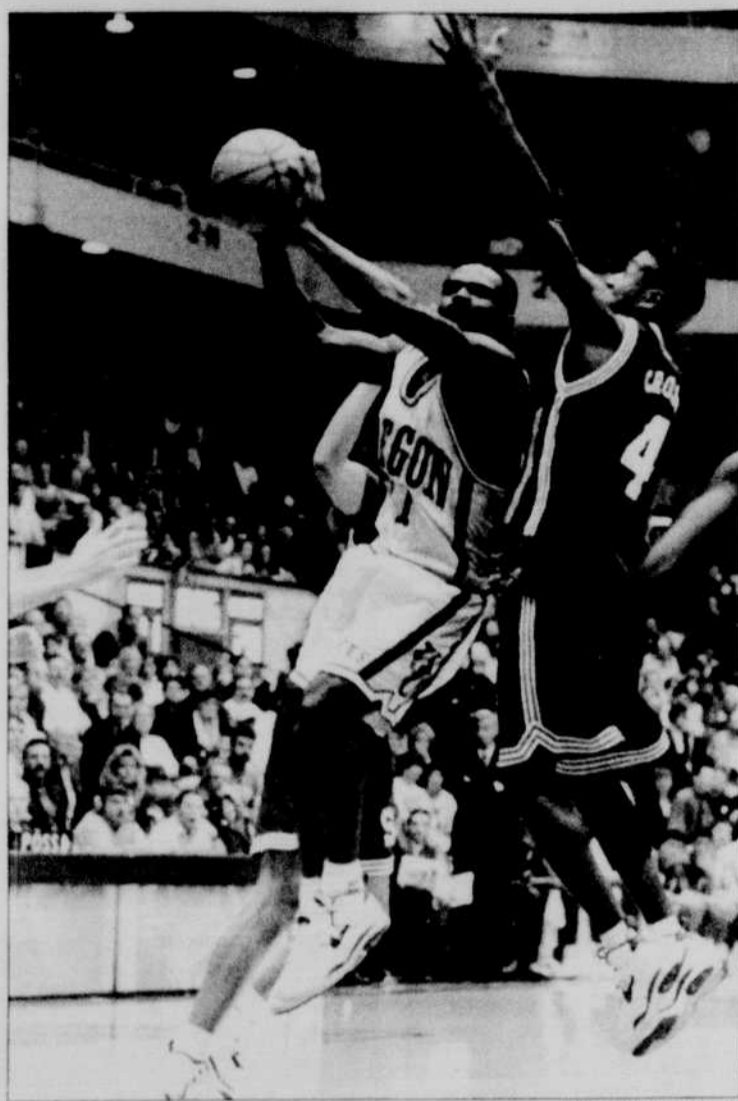
"Initially the plan was to get it to Brent (Williams) or Dion (Cross)," Knight said afterwards. "Coach said if I couldn't pass it, I should go right to the basket. I saw the clock go to seven seconds so I figured I'd go to the basket and try to get fouled. (Johnson) stepped up and made me adjust my shot but luckily I shot it soft enough."

For most of the second half, the game didn't look like it would come down to such a close finish. The Cardinal built up a 61-43 lead with 7:31 left when Brent Williams hit a three-pointer, and some of the fans began to wander out of their seats.

The Ducks didn't give up so easily, as Orlando Williams buried a jumper and Jeff Potter hit four consecutive free throws to get the Ducks within 63-49 with 6:18 left in the game.

Oregon freshman guard Jamar Curry followed two Stanford free throws with a three-pointer and Johnson and Kenya Wilkins hit one free throw each to bring the Ducks closer at 65-54 with four minutes left in the game.

When Johnson and Williams hit three-pointers on consecu-
