ASUO coordinator might freeze USSA accounts

The ASUO finance coordinator will announce Monday whether he will freeze accounts for the local branch of the United States Students Association, a Washington, D.C. based lobbying group, the official said at Thursday night's Incidental Fee Committee meeting.

Francis Neo said he originally considered an audit without freezing the group's accounts, but is now "inclined to freeze" because of an informal inquiry he has made into the group's budget.

A freeze on an account means no purchases may be made

Kris Cornwell, spokesperson for USSA, said Thursday that the group will meet Thursday to discuss the ASUO action and will issue a news release Monday.

Neo is considering this action because the IFC feared the group was misusing IFC funds for personal expenses and expenses not approved by the IFC.

If Neo puts a freeze on the USSA accounts, that would mark the second time the official would have taken that action since September.

Neo froze accounts for the International Students Association Jan. 24 because of fears that the group had no leadership that would be accountable for the

In other IFC news, fee committee members presided over a very calm budget session, doling out either small budget reductions or keeping student program budgets at current levels.

The IFC unanimously approved a 7 percent cut for the Latin American Support Committee, a group that discusses the political issues of Latin America.

The LASC received a budget of \$2,203, down from their current budget level of \$2,368.

The Jewish Student Union received a 4 percent cut, bringing their next year's budget to \$3,920. This is down from their current funding level of \$4,080. The Woman's Law Forum sur-

vived their budget hearing without a cut or increase, leaving them with their current \$3,473 budget.

Budget hearings for the Inter Fraternity Council and the Architecture Students Association have been rescheduled.

Neo said that the IFC had just over \$75,000 in surplus before Thursday's meeting, meaning that if the fee committee approves increases over that amount in the next few months, student fees will be raised.

Neo said \$75,000 doesn't give the group much leeway, especially since they have yet to hear budgets for the EMU and the Athletic Department, both are requesting increases.


