

Men break streak with big win

Don't call it a comeback, but the Oregon men's basketball team broke a 27-game Pacific-10 Conference road losing streak with a 86-71 win over Washington in Seattle Thursday night.

The Ducks, 3-8 in the Pac-10 and 7-13 overall, not only broke

their road losing streak, but also nixed a five-game losing streak.

It wasn't a game between conference powers — the two teams came into the game at ninth and 10th in the conference — and the crowd of barely 2,000 was a testament to that. But a win is a win is a win, and following a couple tough weeks of internal

problems and a tough loss to Oregon State last weekend, Oregon desperately needed the win.

The win was even bigger considering the way the 2-10 Huskies had been playing in the preceding weeks, defeating Arizona last week, USC two weeks ago and taking UCLA down to the wire.

The Ducks stayed close in the first half, and went into the locker room with a 33-32 lead. Oregon came out in the second half and stretched the lead to 60-46 with 6:35 remaining in the game, and held off a late run by the Huskies to win going away.

Duck guard Orlando Williams led the Ducks with 25 points, including three three-pointers to give him the school record in three-point scoring with 160.

Kenya Wilkins added 18 points and dished out five assists.

"The thing that really helped us tonight was that we were patient on offense," head coach Jerry Green said. "And our defense held right in there."

The Ducks shot 48 percent from the field.

Oregon will face Washington State in Pullman Saturday. The Cougars defeated Oregon State 101-67 Thursday.

Women's hoops hammers Huskies

Call it great defense or call it awful shooting. Either way, Washington couldn't score.

The Oregon women's basketball team handed the No. 15 Huskies a 62-41 loss Thursday night at McArthur Court. The victory moved Oregon, 8-3 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 14-6 overall, into a tie for second place in the Pac-10.

Washington, 8-4 and 16-5, dropped to fourth in the league standings. Oregon held the Huskies to Washington's lowest point total in a game since 1992. The 21-point victory was the largest margin of defeat for Washington this season.

Oregon held Washington to a .271 field goal percentage while shooting 58 percent from the floor.

The game seasawed for the first seven minutes, then Oregon took the lead at 8-6 and extended it through the remainder of the first half. The Ducks outscored Washington 7-1 in the final 1:23 of the half and took a 30-18 advantage into halftime.

The Huskies closed within

eight points of Oregon twice in the first four minutes of the second half. However, Oregon responded with an 11-0 run, and Washington never recovered.

Oregon led by as many as 26, and the Huskies never came close to a comeback. Washington went for what amounted to the entire second half before it scored a field goal from outside five feet.

Sara Wilson led the Ducks in scoring with 15 points. Jessica Schutt had 13 points and Debbie Sporcich had 13 points and 12 rebounds.

Washington's full-court defensive pressure, a major concern for Oregon in preparing for the game, forced 33 turnovers, but Washington committed 28 turnovers.

Oregon head coach Jody Runge gave credit to point guard Missy Croshaw after the game.

"She played with everything she had. She had somebody hawking her the whole night, and we would have gotten beat by 50 if Missy Croshaw did not handle the ball for us," Runge said.
