

Men's golf takes 12th; tennis wins a couple

The Oregon men's golf team finished 12th at the Big Island Intercollegiate in Waikoloa, Hawaii, while the women's team grabbed fifth place after the first round of the Chris Johnson Arizona Invitational after the first round.

The men played well against a strong field in Hawaii, but their scores dropped during each round of the three-day tournament. Oregon opened the tournament with a 7-over-par 295 Saturday before finishing with rounds of 295 and 302. Oregon's 894 total left them in the middle of the 24-team field.

Junior Ted Snavelly led the Ducks, shooting an even-par 216 to finish tied for eighth place individually. Snavelly opened the tournament with a 72 before posting a 69 in the second round. Snavelly finished up with a 75.

Paul Regali, Andy Scheidt

and Randy McCracken all shot 227 for the Ducks to finish tied for 59th place. Regali shot 73 in the first round and followed with rounds of 75 and 79 on Sunday and Monday, respectively.

Scheidt shot 74 Saturday and 75 on Monday, with a 78 sandwiched in between. McCracken shot back-to-back 77's in the first two rounds before coming back with a 73 on the final day.

Arizona State won the team title at 851, followed by fifth-ranked Stanford at 855. The Cardinal's Notah Begay shot rounds of 71-66-69 to win medalist honors.

The Oregon women got consistent performances all around to tie three other teams for fifth place at 304 after the first round of their tournament.

Junior Rebecca Giersdorf shot 75, while teammates Karly Mills and Shannon Hare shot 76's to lead the Ducks. Senior Cappy Mack added a 77 while sopho-

more Christel Tomori shot 79. Giersdorf is in 12th place individually, 13 slots ahead of Mills and Hare.

Arizona State took the early lead at 392, but Oregon is only five shots behind second-place Texas. Wake Forest's Stephanie Neill and Heather Bowie of Arizona State share the first-round lead at 71.

The tournament concludes Wednesday.

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The Oregon men's tennis team won two of three matches during a weekend trip to California to raise its record to 10-5 this year.

The Ducks finished the trip in style, shutting out UC Davis 6-0. Five of the six Duck men won their matches against UC Davis in straight sets. Oregon's John DeVors had the easiest time, defeating Gene Lee, 6-1, 6-2.

Oregon opened the trip by

splitting matches against Pacific and Sacramento State. The Ducks defeated Sacramento State 4-3 before falling to Pacific, 5-2. Against the Hornets, both teams won three singles matches, but the Ducks picked up victories in two of three doubles matches.

Junior Dana Partovi and sophomore Luke Rencher went undefeated for the Ducks throughout the weekend, winning three singles matches and teaming together for a pair of doubles wins. Partovi and Rencher made quick work of their opponents, winning each of their matches in straight sets.

Lee Kirner played well for the men as well, winning two of three singles matches and teaming with DeVors for a doubles victory.

The men will practice for the next month before resuming their schedule during Spring Break.

Pistol team impresses in its debut

The Oregon club pistol shooting team, back on campus after a long absence, made some noise this weekend at the Intercollegiate Sectionals in Corvallis.

The Ducks entered three teams in the tournament, and finished second, third and fifth among five teams in the standard pistol shooting category. The event is composed primarily of men, but women can enter as well, said Jim Smith, who is coaching this year's team along with Keith Munsen.

Washington won the event with Oregon State coming in fourth place. Leading the way for Oregon was Todd Wichman, who finished in second place with 512 points out of a possible 600. Wichman missed winning the individual title by only six points.

Scott Ritchie and Scott Carpiak also shot well for Oregon, finishing in seventh and 12th place, respectively.

On the women's side, the Ducks' three teams finished in second, third and fourth place. Erika Ungern led Oregon with a 14th place finish, one spot ahead of teammate Sara Balz.

The club, which disbanded years ago, was reformed by Smith and Munsen in January. The Ducks received praise from many people at the tournament for putting on such a strong performance after only seven weeks of practice, Smith said.

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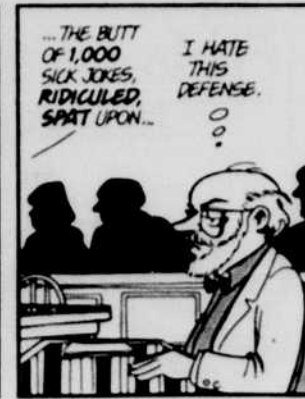
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
