Sonnen's title leads wrestlers into fifth place

Oregon wrestler Cory Sonnen won the Pacific-10 Conference title at 142 pounds, leading five Ducks who qualified for the NCAA Championships at the conference meet in San Luis Obispo, Calif. last weekend.

The Ducks finished fourth in the nine-team field with 88 points, 40 points behind conference champion Oregon State.

Sonnen was seeded third at 142 pounds, but became the first Oregon wrestler in two years to win the conference title. Sonnen

made it to the finals Sunday after beating Cal Davis' Dat Ngo and No. 2 seed Pat Morrissey of Cal-Poly in the first two rounds on Saturday. Sonnen won the title by defeating Ken Workman of Cal-State Fullerton 5-4 in the finals.

Oregon's Kevin Roberts and Chris Jensen also qualified for the finals at 118 and 126 pounds, respectively, but lost those matches. Roberts scored victories over Oregon State's Rich Wheeler and Cal-State Bakersfield's Bobby Soto on Saturday before falling to Arizona

State's Danny Felix in the finals, 8-6.

Jensen beat Arizona State's Paul Gagich and Cal-State Fullerton's Jeff Maes on Saturday, but lost to Dave Nieradka of Oregon State, 9-1, in the championship.

Oregon's Mat Sprague and Chris Anderson also qualified for the NCAA meet by finishing third in their divisions. Sprague recovered from a narrow loss to Arizona State's Pat Lynch, 7-6, in the third round to beat Pascal Duru of Cal-State Bakersfield, 5-4, at 177 pounds.

Anderson shut out Stanford's Scott Whitt in the first round before losing 4-0 to Kevin Langley of Cal-State Bakersfield. Anderson claimed third place by scoring another shutout, 4-0 over Boise State's Shawn Stipich.

Pat Hirai (134) and 150-pound Scott Norton finished fifth and sixth, respectively. Hirai beat Cal-State Fullerton's Farzin Daneshnia 8-6 to claim fifth place.

The five Ducks who qualified will compete in the NCAA Championships March 17-19 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Softball wins five straight before loss in tourney

The Oregon softball team qualified for the finals of the Spring Fling in only its second tournament of the year before losing to Hawaii 3-1 in the championship game in Las Vegas, Nev., Sunday.

The Ducks lost the opening game of the tournament to Hawaii but came back to post five consecutive wins before falling to the Rainbows again in the finals.

The Ducks fell behind 1-0 in the first inning of the championship game before Kathy Stahl hit a home run in the top of the

sixth inning to tie the game 1-1. An Oregon error in the bottom of the sixth allowed two Hawaii runs to cross the plate and give the Rainbows a 3-1 victory.

Pitcher Rachelle Taylor picked up the loss, giving up eight singles and striking out three batters before seeing her five-game winning streak come to an end. Taylor's record dropped to 6-3 on the season.

The Ducks qualified for the finals with a 4-0 shutout over South Carolina earlier Sunday. Freshman Barbie Hickson gave up only three hits on the way to evening her season record at 2-2.

The Ducks gave Hickson support early, getting a run in the first inning to take a 1-0 lead. Oregon built on the lead in the fifth inning when Lisa Preston's single to left field scored a pair of runs, giving the Ducks a 3-0 lead. Jennifer Piper's solo home run in the sixth inning closed out Oregon's scoring.

The Ducks qualified for the finals Sunday by sweeping three opponents Saturday. The Ducks opened the day with a 4-0 win over No. 23 Sacramento State in which Lisa Preston and Laura Schmidt each hit home runs.

Oregon knocked off Pacific, 7-3, in the second game Saturday.

The Ducks fell behind 3-1 after the first inning, but knocked in six runs in the second inning to take the lead for good. Hickson picked up her first collegiate win against Pacific, and Stahl and Melissa Lemke provided the offense with three and two hits, respectively.

Oregon fell behind early again against the Rebels and trailed 3-2 heading into the bottom of the third inning. The Ducks gained the lead for the first time in the third when Laura Schmidt's triple highlighted a three-run inning to give the Ducks a 5-3 lead that would stand up as the final score.

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
