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Philyaw, Godfrey lead track teams

The Oregon men's and women's track teams got their final warm up for the outdoor season at the Mountain Pacific Federation Indoor last weekend in Reno, Nev.

Leading the way for the Ducks was junior Dino Philyaw, who finished third in the 55-meter final Saturday in a time of 6.34 seconds. Philyaw, who is also a member of the Oregon football team, qualified for the finals by winning the third heat in 6.44 seconds.

Patrick Khoo and Sol Sallos

gave Oregon its other top performances in sprints, finishing second and fifth in their 400-meter heats, respectively. Khoo finished the third heat with a time of 49.98, .36 seconds ahead of Sollos' time in the second heat.

Oregon's Benjamin Andrew's finished sixth in the mile with a time of 4:18.12, and LaVon Pierce took eighth in the 200 in 22.36 seconds. High jumper Eric White placed seventh with a height of 6-foot-7 inches.

The Oregon women's top sprinter was Jamila Godfrey, who finished sixth in the 55-meters in 7.55 seconds. Godfrey also ran the 200 meters and finished second

in the third heat with a time of 25.01.

Mary Gilbert paced three Ducks in the 55 meter hurdles with a time of 8.74 seconds in the second heat. Gilbert finished highest among Oregon field competitors, taking fifth place in the triple jump with a leap of 39-1 1/4 feet.

Alison Breedlove won her heat of the 400 meters in a time of 59.86, while Nicole Commissiong finished the race in 56.82 seconds, but finished third. Amo Olson took seventh place with a high jump of 5-4 1/4 feet and Tonia Roth finished 10th in the shot put with a toss of 41 feet.

Arizona State dominated the tournament, finishing at 869 to win the tournament by 26 shots over UCLA.
