the Ducks were surprised by the departure of Willy Tate last week for personal reasons. Brooks is looking forward to filling the holes left open.

"There are a lot of positions in the air," Brooks said. "The anticipation of competition is one of the most enjoyable phases of coaching."

O'Neil will once again anchor the offense, and despite losing the talented backfield of Sean Burwell and Juan Shedrick, the Ducks have talent in Ricky Whittle and Pulou Malepeai, both of whom saw extended playing time last year.

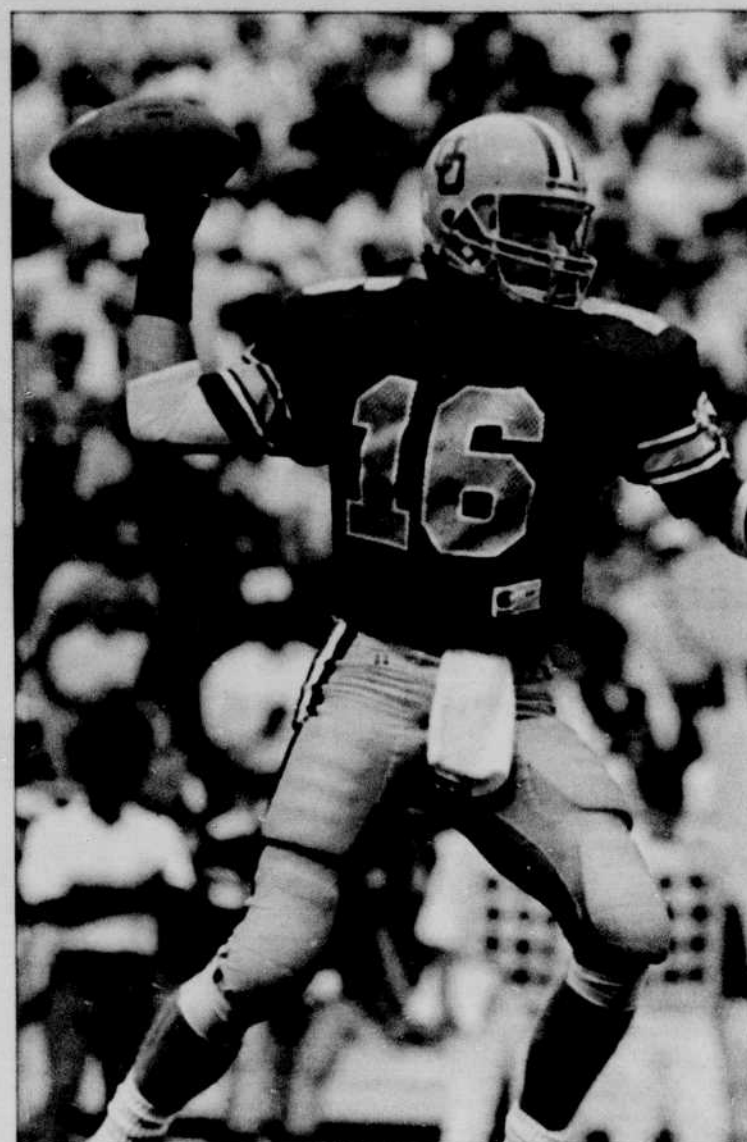
The loss of Tate and seniors Derrick Deadwiler and Burwell means Oregon loses three of its top four receivers from a year ago, but junior-to-be Cristin McLemore makes the losses easier to deal with. McLemore had a huge season in 1993, catching 50 passes, including 10 for touchdowns. In addition to McLemore, there is the talented but unproven group of receivers that includes Jamal Wallace, Kory Murphy and Dameron Ricketts.

"The receivers look outstanding," O'Neil said. "We only lost Deadwiler, who did a lot of things for us, and we gained younger receivers so I'm really excited."

Some of the spring's most intense competition may come on the offensive line, where there are many candidates to replace four departed starters. Paul Wiggins, John Wenig, Mark Gregg, Dave Cuttrell and Eric Reid are among those looking to join right tackle Steve Hardin on the line.

Defensively, the Ducks need to replace five of seven starters up front but will be hampered by injuries during the spring. Mark Slymen, Troy Bailey and Jerome Perryman are all candidates to replace Romeo Bandison and Gary Williams at defensive end, but they will miss spring training because of injuries.

The Ducks also must replace three linebackers to join all-Pacific-10 Conference second-team selection Jeremy Asher. Junior middle linebacker Rich Ruhl is the only other Duck who has started at linebacker, while Reggie Jordan and Paul Jensen are atop the depth chart at outside linebacker.

The secondary should be the Ducks' strongest area defensively, if they can remain healthy. Cornerbacks Alex Molden and Herman O'Berry were spectacular together in 1992, but O'Berry missed almost the entire 1993 season and Molden was slowed by injury as well. Dante Lewis and Chad Cota return at safety where they were mainstays a year ago.

Oregon's most important hole to fill for next year, the kicking game, won't get much attention in spring because the leading candidates for those spots, Josh Bidwell and Matt Belden, are recruits who won't be in Eugene until the fall. For now, Eric Johannsen is the kicker, while the punting duties will be filled by O'Neil.

"(Danny's) got a long way to go," Brooks said. "But he's the best we've got right now on campus. I think he can do a credible job as a punter if we're forced into that situation."

Brooks isn't the only one hoping that one of the freshmen gets the punting job.

"I tell you one thing, I hope the guys coming in are a lot better than I am because if I have to punt next year it's not going to be a great advantage," O'Neil said.

"If this team needs me as a punter, I just want to be able to punt it with decent efficiency. Just don't look at me too much when I'm punting; I'm not too good."

O'Neil hopes the same won't be said of his team next year.

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
