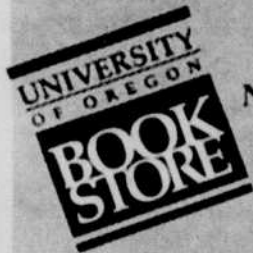


We Need People of Vision Who Want To Make A Positive Difference To Serve On Our Board.

• The dean of the University Business School will speak Thursday on economic changes in Southeast Asia.

James Reinmuth, who has extensively researched the emergence of Southeast Asia as an economic power, will speak at the Eugene Downtown Athletic Club, 999 Willamette St. Admission is \$11 for the 11:45 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. luncheon and lecture.

• A film detailing the armed invasion of Hawaii by colonizing citizens of the United States will be shown April 16 in Willamette Hall, Room 100. The director, native Hawaiian Puhipau, will lead a panel discussion following "Act of War."
