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Louisiana Tech avoids penalty, gets probation

RUSTON, La. (AP) — Louisiana Tech's men's basketball program was placed on one-year probation Tuesday by the NCAA but escaped without any penalties.

"We feel real good about the way this is being wrapped up," said athletic director Jerry Stovall. "We worked with the NCAA throughout the inquiry, have corrected problems and will make sure they stay corrected now."

The probation was for various infractions in the basketball program, including the paying of a potential player's junior college tuition by former assistant coach Kyle Keller.

The infractions took place under former coach Jerry Loyd, who resigned at the end of the 1993-94 season after the team went 2-25. Keller also resigned

after the investigation began.

The university was reprimanded and told to have its current athletic policies and practices recertified by the NCAA.

"Basically they gave us one year to implement seminars and training for all our coaches as well as other personnel on recruiting, rules, regulations financial regulations, a whole range of issues," Stovall said.

Loyd also was reprimanded. The NCAA infractions committee report released Tuesday said the university cooperated fully in the investigation and waived appeals.

"We worked under the direction of both of those groups," Stovall said. "We notified them immediately and said that we didn't know if we had anything serious."

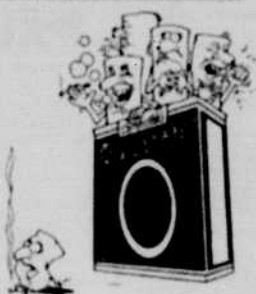

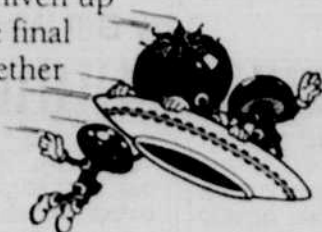

Sprague set for Festival

Junior Mat Sprague qualified for the U.S. Olympic Festival this summer with a fourth-place finish at the University Nationals in freestyle wrestling held in Evanston, Ill. Sunday.

The 180.5-pound Portland native was the only one of the eight Oregon wrestlers at the tournament to advance to the Olympic Festival by placing in the top four of his weight class.

Three others wrestlers, James Stephens, Jeremy Ensrud and John Taylor also placed. Stephens, a sophomore from Everett, Wash., was seventh at 125.5 pounds, one place ahead of teammate Ensrud, who finished eighth. Taylor, a freshman from Olympia, Wash., also finished eighth at 114.5 pounds.

In other wrestling news, Oregon sophomore All-American Kevin Roberts has been selected to compete for the United States team being assembled by the National Wrestling Coaches Association this summer.

Roberts placed fourth at last month's NCAA Wrestling Championships in the 118-pound classification. Only All-American wrestlers who are underclassmen are eligible for inclusion on this touring squad.

The tour will be to Germany from June 12 to 21. Last year's squad placed third in the tournament held in Italy, finishing behind Iran and Russia.

Roberts will compete in the 125.5-pound freestyle competition.
