well aware of what's going on on the campus," Rofsky said.

Soto said she applied for the position because she has enjoyed working at the *Emerald* and believes the editorial content of the paper has a few weak points.

The new editor plans to be more available for the staff, to give reporters the help they need finding resources and to make the *Emerald* a friendlier paper.

She said she wants to focus more

on the social qualities of a newspaper instead of the technical emphasis currently placed on the *Emerald*. Soto said she hopes to strengthen connections between the newspaper and the campus community.

Soto is currently the *Emerald's* supplements editor and has four years of experience working for a newspaper.

The board of directors interviewed each candidate several times. Before meeting with the board, candidates had to be interviewed by *Emerald* department heads and staff.

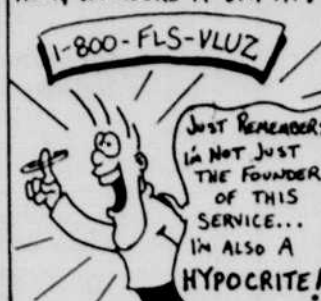
