Men take second in 4x400, meet

It came down to the 4x400-meter relay. To beat UCLA, Oregon would have to rely on a team that included a high jumper and an intermediate hurdler. Middle distance specialist Gordon Johnson substituted for injured anchor man LaVon Pierce.

Oregon ran its fastest 4x400 of the season. UCLA ran faster. Michael Williams of UCLA out-sprinted Johnson on the final leg, and UCLA beat Oregon 88-85 at the Pepsi Team Invitational at Hayward Field on Saturday. Washington finished third in the three-team competition with 30 points.

"It was a great meet. I would have liked to be on the other side of the score, but it was still a good meet," Oregon head coach Bill Dellinger said.

The Oregon women's track team won a total of one event and finished third at the Pepsi Team Invitational at Hayward Field on Saturday.

UCLA took first in 10 of the 17 events and finished with 185 points. Washington

was second with 156, followed by the Ducks with 135 and Washington State with 118.

The finish for Oregon ended its seven-year string of titles in the Invitational.

Even the one win the Ducks could muster on the
