Trios sign with softball and golf

The Oregon softball and women's golf teams added three players each to next season's rosters when they received national letters of intent last week.

Oregon softball coach Tami Brown grabbed local product Missy Koke of Churchill and California natives Rissa Perryman and Petrina Martinez. The women's golf team stayed in-state to sign a trio of players, including defending 4A state champion Paula Patterson of Central Catholic.

Martinez and Perryman will try to replace for the battery of Rachelle Taylor and Laura Schmidt, who depart with numerous school records in four years.

Martinez, a right-handed pitcher from San Pedro, Calif., was 14-1 with a 0.35 ERA last year as a junior at San Pedro High School. Martinez helped her team capture back-to-back 4A Los Angeles city championships in 1992 and 1993, as well as the 1993 Los Angeles Watts Summer Games title.

"Petrina will really add to our pitching and be a great addition," Brown said. "She has a good mix of pitches and keeps people off balance. She's small (5-foot-4), but she has such a determined mentality. I couldn't pass her up."

Koke, an outfielder, will also join the Ducks as a freshman next season. Koke was named second-team all-state last year after pacing the Lancers with a .365 batting average from the leadoff spot.

"She's very quick, and we recruited her for her speed," Brown said. "She's a slapper and bunter, but we will help her develop some power. Missy is small but fiery and comes from a great high school program and a wonderful family."

In addition to the freshmen, Brown also looked

into the junior colleges to grab Perryman from Sacramento City College. The Sacramento native is rated as one of the top junior college catchers in California after leading her team to the state championship in 1993 with a .373 batting average.

Meanwhile, Oregon women's golf coach Lara Mack went with exclusively Oregon high school stars for her team next year. In addition to Patterson, Mack signed Monica Moran of Central High School in Independence, and Kristen Berney from Bend High School to national letter of intents.

All three were part of last year's Junior America's Cup, a team comprised of the top four golfers in the state based on points awarded during summer tournament play.

In addition to the state championship, Patterson also won the Portland's city junior championship and was named Mount Hood Conference player of the year in 1993.

"Paula is an experienced player who will have an immediate impact on the team," Mack said.

Moran won the 1992 and 1993 3A state championship along with her district title each year since freshman year. She finished as the runner-up at the Oregon Junior Championships last summer.

"Monica loves the game of golf and is a strong, athletic player," Mack said. "She has a real desire to succeed in golf and I'm sure she will be one of our top players at Oregon in the years to come."

Berney helped the Lava Bears to the state 4A title last year and won five tournaments last summer, including the Oregon Junior Championships.

"Kristen is very talented and has worked very hard the past few years to develop her game to become one of the top high school golfers in Oregon," Mack said.

Cobo gets win in Ducks last tourney

The Oregon men's tennis team completed postseason play by competing against members of some of the toughest teams in the country last Thursday and Friday at the Open Collegiate Invitational in Ojai, Calif.

Freshman Matt Cobo scored Oregon's only win at the Open Collegiate Invitational, advancing to the second round before
