Runge adds a player, tennis nabs four more

The Oregon women's basketball team has filled another hole on its roster as the women's tennis team signed four players to national letters of intent this week.

Kristin Niemann, a 5-foot-8 guard from El Camino High School in Sacramento, Calif., signed a national letter of intent to play basketball with the Ducks. Tuesday Niemann was the California Division II state player of the year averaging 22.7 points per game for a team that went 36-0 and won the 1994 state championship.

Niemann shot 49.7 percent from the field and 77 percent from the free throw line while averaging 4.4 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.1 assists per game. She was named to the *Cal-Hi Sports* second-team all-state.

"Kristin is an outstanding player who is a good shooter

and a great competitor," Oregon head coach Jody Runge said. "She is the same type of shooter in the mold of a Jessica Schutt and a Karen Healea who can be of an immediate help now before moving into a starting role in the future."

Runge, who earlier this month signed junior college transfer Cicely Brewster, still has five scholarships open for next season.

In tennis, departing head coach Tom Greider signed four players to letters of intent Tuesday.

The only in-state recruit among the four is Hannah King of Corvallis, who is ranked eighth in the Girls' 18 and Under Championship Classification in the Pacific Northwest and regarded as the top senior in the state.

Allison Sosnow from Tucson, Ariz. also signed with the Ducks. A left-hander with a great serve and volley, Sosnow is ranked seventh in the Southwest Tennis Association, playing for St. Gregory College Preparatory.

The other two recruits are Ashley Fuller of Edina, Minn. and Caryn Coyle from Torrance, Calif. Fuller is in the top five in the Upper Midwest Tennis Association, and Coyle is ranked in the top 25 of Girls' 18 and Under in the Southern California Tennis Association. Both Fuller and Coyle are accomplished playing doubles matches in addition to singles.

Greider is resigning his post at Oregon this spring to devote more time to his business at Willow Creek Racquet Club. Men's assistant coach Wade Judy will replace Greider as head women's coach July 1.

want to do is get the ball in Ricky's hands and I'll let him do his stuff."

Whittle said he's hoping Burwell can give him advice on how to get open in the flat.

"It's not unusual for running backs to do a route," Whittle said. "Basically what Sean did was get open a lot. He found a way to get open and that's a secret only Sean holds. Maybe I can get it from him."

Philyaw, who also saw some time at cornerback last season, is going through his first spring drills with the Ducks. A year ago, the senior from Dudley, N.C., was finishing up at Taft Junior College in North Carolina.

"I'm really looking forward to seeing what Dino can do," Brooks said. "There's no question he has tremendous ability - speed, quickness. I'm looking forward to having a guy with the speed of Dino Philyaw be more of a factor in our offense than he was a year ago."

Philyaw is having a busy spring, because in addition to school and football, he is also running sprints for the Oregon track team, where he's run a team-best 21.36 in the 200 meters.

"It's kind of fun," Philyaw said of his experience on the track. "It keeps me doing two separate things, so I can't get bored. It keeps me tired."

With only two other players to share the reps at halfback with, football is doing the same thing.
