

Men's track off to relays

The Oregon men's track team doesn't have a dual meet this weekend, so it's taking a vacation. Sort of.

Members of the Oregon team will compete at the Drake Relays in Des Moines, Iowa, and at the Penn Relays in Philadelphia, on Friday and Saturday.

Head coach Bill Dellinger and 11 Oregon athletes are in Des Moines. The Drake Relays, like its counterpart in Philadelphia, features more than track events. Dan Zorich (discus, hammer), Dusty Carlson (hammer, shot put) Ray Livingston (pole vault) and Jeremy Williams (pole vault) are among the Ducks scheduled to compete.

All six of Oregon's NCAA provisional qualifiers are in Des Moines. Zorich, Carlson and Livingston are joined by Oregon's three qualifiers in the distance events. Gordon Johnson (1,500 meters), Scott Nicholas (1,500) and Karl Keska (5,000) are scheduled to compete.

Oregon's distance crew will concentrate on two relays. The three NCAA provisional qualifiers are expected to join Rick Cantwell for what should be a formidable 4x1,600-meter relay team. The Ducks also have a team entered in the distance medley relay, where intermediate hurdler Sol Sallos will team-up with Johnson, Nicholas and Cantwell.

The Duck sprinters, along with high jumper Eric White and triple jumper Todd Bleakney, will be in Philadelphia. Eric Trice, DeWayne Ingram, LaVon Pierce and Patrick Khoo will run in the 4x100 and 4x200 events. The

sprint crew is without Dino Philyaw and LaMont Woods, who will play in Saturday's football scrimmage.

The relays come a week after a surprising performance by the team in the Pepsi Invitational, where Oregon came within one event of upsetting one of the best track teams in the nation. The competition between the Ducks and UCLA came down to the

final event of the triangular meet, with UCLA winning the 4x400 relay.

"Our meet last week with UCLA and Washington was one of the best we've had at Hayward Field in quite some time," Dellinger said. "You have to give UCLA credit for winning. They had to travel and then to compete in an environment they were not

Women head east for Drake Relays

Thirteen members of the the Oregon women's track team will travel east this weekend for the Drake Relays in Des Moines, Iowa.

The Ducks are coming off a third place finish at last weekend's Pepsi Team Invitational. It was the first time in seven years Oregon did not finish first at the four-team meet. Despite that, head coach Tom Heinonen likes where his team is at.

"I think we're ahead, ahead of where we were (at the start of the season)," he said. "We just made up a lot of ground on Washington."

This weekend's meet begins this morning with the 4x100 preliminaries. The Ducks will have Jamila Godfrey, Nicole Commissiong, Shawna Kraskowski and Lisa Bedwell running in the race. The foursome ran its best race of the season last weekend when they clocked a 46.06 against UCLA, Washington and Washington State.

The 4x400 team will also get a chance to improve on its season-best time from last weekend. The same team will run the longer relay with the exception of Nilka Thomas replacing Godfrey.

"We're ready to run fast now in the 4x400 when we get the opportunity and we think that will happen at Drake," Heinonen said. "We think the 4x100 can go pretty fast too, we've finally got the right lineup but our handoffs have been pretty miserable."

Also in action for the Ducks will be standouts Milena Glusac and Kelly Blair.

Blair and Glusac have both reached provisional qualifying times for the NCAA meet. Glusac in the 3,000 and 5,000 and Blair in the 100-meter hurdles. The two will compete on the same relay team, the distance relay, with Thomas and Christie Engesser.

Blair will also compete in the high jump, long jump and javelin. All that, however depends on how well she recovers from a sprained foot she suffered last weekend.

In other events, Oregon will have Sara Howell in the triple jump, Joni Wareham in the 5,000, Glusac in the 1,500, Engesser in the 800 and Amo Olson in the high jump.

The Ducks will return home next weekend for a meet with Boise State and Nevada-Las Vegas.
