

Softball rises in the polls, beats Portland State

The Oregon softball team celebrated its rise in the national polls this week with a doubleheader sweep of Portland State on Wednesday.

DUCKS NOTES

The Ducks moved up from No. 15 to No. 10 in the country and went about proving the pollsters right Wednesday, beating the Vikings 10-0 and 3-1.

Kathy Stahl began the day with a good start, leading off the first game with her fifth home run of the year, to give the Ducks a lead for good. Oregon's bats came alive in the third inning, pounding out 10 hits and scoring nine runs to give the Ducks a 10-0 lead. The 10-run rule came into effect, forcing the game to be stopped after five innings.

In the second game, Portland State took

an early 1-0 lead with a run in the third inning, while pitcher Kim Holum quieted the Ducks' bats for the first four innings. In the fifth inning, Heather Holte hit a three-run homer, her fifth of the season, to give the Ducks a 3-1 lead. Kim Kampfer made the lead stand up, pitching her third complete game of the year, allowing seven hits and one run, to raise her record to 4-0.

After spending all of April at home, the Ducks hit the road again this week for games at Washington and Puget Sound. Oregon's final home game of the year is a doubleheader against fifth-ranked UCLA May 11.

The Oregon women's golf team finished fifth at the Pacific-10 Conference Championships earlier this week in Los Angeles, Calif.

The Ducks shot rounds of 323-317-317 to finish comfortably in fifth place. Oregon's No. 14 national ranking was behind five other teams in the conference, but the Ducks beat No. 13 Arizona by 11 strokes.

Top-ranked Arizona State won its second straight Pac-10 title, moving ahead of third-ranked USC on the final day to finish the three-day event at 920, four shots ahead of the Trojans. No. 4 UCLA finished fourth at 928 followed by sixth-ranked Stanford at 935.

Junior Karly Mills led the Ducks with a three-round score of 233, tying her for ninth place overall. Oregon's Cappy Mack, Shannon Hare and Christel Tomori finished right behind each other with scores of 242, 243 and 244, respectively, and junior Leigh Casey finished at 253.

Rosy Gardner, who posted the nation's

fastest prep 1,600-meter mark of the year earlier this month winning the event at the Arcadia Invitational, has signed a national letter-of-intent to attend Oregon according to women's track coach Tom Heinonen.

The 5-foot-8 Utah standout from East High School in Salt Lake City owns the fastest times in the state in the 800, 1,600 and 3,200 meters after recording her metric mile time of 4:53.11, and claimed the state record in the 800 meters a week ago in a time of 2:13.29. She also turned in a personal best of 10:40.1 this season in the 3,200.

"Rosy is really coming on strong during the right time of her high school career," Heinonen said. "She's already bettered all of her personal records this season and holds the state records in her best three events. We really need a miler of her ability, so we expect Rosy to give us a real boost next year."

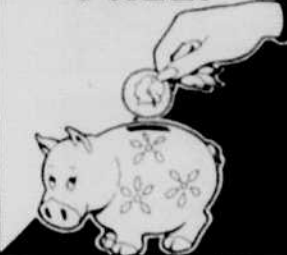
