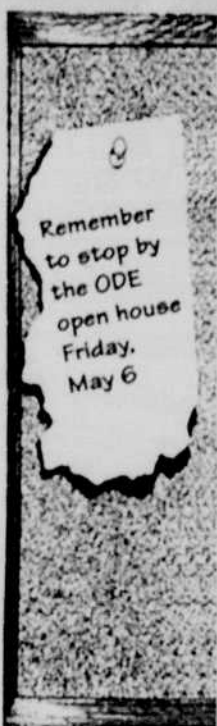

Oregon cyclist Roesinger wins race

Oregon cyclist Eric Roesinger won the Category 4 race at last weekend's Tour of Willamette, highlighting the Ducks' performance.

Hundreds of cyclists showed up for the five-day event which began April 20. The Tour included three road races, two time trials and a criterium.

Roesinger won the road race Friday morning and placed third in the time trial Friday afternoon. Saturday Roesinger took second place in the road race before winning the criterium Sunday.

This week Roesinger will be upgraded to Category 3 when the Ducks compete in the Woodrat and Pair Blossoms races in Ashland. Other Oregon racers competing this weekend include Bob Booth, Justin Davanzo and Robert Shigeta.

and Oregon State. While the women were in California, the men were in Seattle, where they finished in second place, behind only Washington, at the Husky Invitational.

The next weekend, both the men and women traveled up the road for the Corvallis Invitational, to battle for Civil War bragging rights. The varsity men took home the trophy in their division and the men's novice placed second to OSU. The women almost

pulled off an unbelievable upset of the national powerhouse Beavers before losing by only eight one-hundredths of a second, the closest the Ducks have ever come to beating the Beavers.

Upcoming events for the crew teams include: Regional Championships, May 14-15 on Vancouver Lake in Portland; Pacific Coast Championships, May 21-22 in Sacramento; and the IRAs, June 3-5 in New York for a possible national title.

The Ducks got big performance from its athletes in the jumps, who took first place in each event in the group. Also starring for the Ducks was Keska.

Keska won at the wire in the 1,500. With Oregon needing points near the end of the meet, he became a last-minute entry in the 5,000 and won again.

"Karl Keska did a great job coming back in the 5,000 with five minutes notice," Dellinger said. "I wish I had not had to do that to him. We thought he might run a 5,000 this week at the Drake Relays, but now he won't."
