chairman of the Mid-Oregon Ad Club, presented a new public service campaign aimed at raising awareness of sexual assault.

"As part of our commitment to public service, we have formed a partnership with SASS," Miller said. "We chose to work with them because ... this is an area we believe really needs to be focused on."

The campaign includes three print ads and one radio spot. One of the print ads reads, "Not Everyone In Lane County Is A Victim Of Sexual Assault. Just 65,486 Of Us Are." The number is based on the statistic that one in four people have been sexually assaulted. At the bottom of the ad are three numbers for victims to call for sup-

port.

The ad campaign was put together by a group of professionals in several local ad agencies. Miller declined to estimate the number of dollars it took to create the campaign, saying only "thousands and thousands."

Rust said he hopes the ads will make people think before committing sexual crimes.

"We have to prevent some of these crimes from happening in the first place," he said.

Sexual Assault Support Services has been serving the public for almost three years with a 24-hour crisis line, counseling, advocacy and support for victims and families.

Iranian Students Association and Students for Ethical Treatment of Animals because the groups either turned in budgets late, appealed too late, or did both. The groups will receive no funding next year.

"They consistently missed deadlines," said IFC member Joey Lyons.

Twain said the groups were given ample time to create and submit budgets and appeal with any concerns. The IFC did hear two special requests and three appeals.

The University chapter of the YWCA received \$350 for a special request to help send five people to the YWCA National Assembly to learn about elimination of racism and sexism in America. The University chapter of the YWCA has not been able to attend the national assembly for 10 years. Vikki Michalios, executive director of

the University YWCA, said they worked hard to raise the money for this year's trip.

ESCAPE received \$279 for a special request to help send a representative to "Super Conference '94," which was to promote implementation of community service programs across the country.

Avenue, a campus literary publication, received an increase of \$495 on appeal to offset rising printing costs. Its budget is at \$3,780, compared to \$3,285 last year.

The Chinese Student Scholar's Association received an increase of \$269 for programming costs. Its budget stands at \$1,877 from \$1,608 last year.

The Latin American and Caribbean Students organization received a minor increase on appeal of \$93. It has a \$630 budget for next year over \$537 from the year before.

The IFC will have its last budget hearing Friday.
