

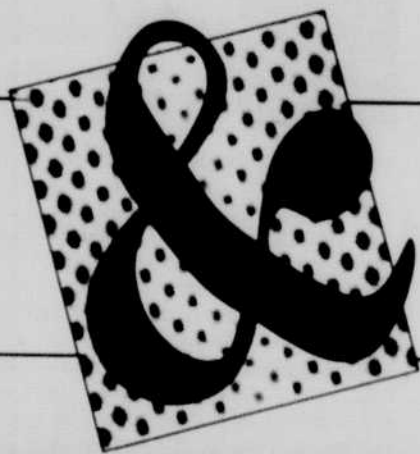

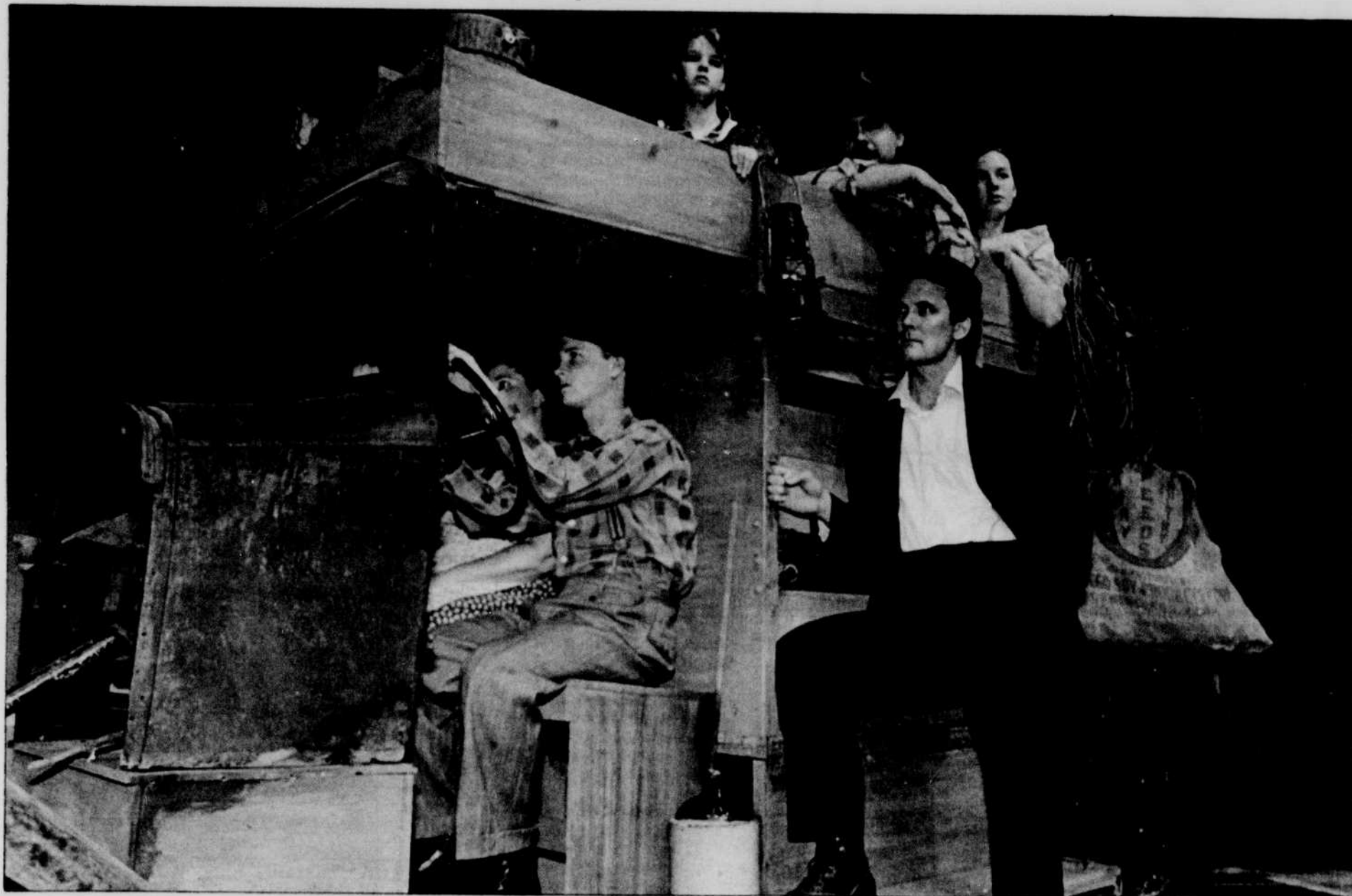

The Grapes of Wrath tells the story of the Joad family and their flight from the dust bowl of Oklahoma. Desperately proud, but reduced to poverty by the loss of their farm, the Joads pile their few possessions on a battered old truck and head west for California, hoping to find work and a better life. Led by the indomitable Ma Joad and by the volatile young Tom Joad, the family must deal with death and terrible deprivation before reaching their destination where their waning hopes are dealt a final blow by the stark realities of the Great Depression. A benefit performance will be given on May 15 at 2 p.m. with proceeds going to Sponsors, Inc.

Author Terry Tempest Williams will sign copies of her new book, *An Unspoken Hunger*, from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m. at the University Bookstore today.

An Unspoken Hunger, William's third book, is a collection of essays about the relationship between women and nature. She is known as one of the most eloquent voices of the American West, said a press release. In this collection she illuminates the strength and inspiration that helped to form Georgia O'Keeffe, Rachel Carson, Mardy Murie and the Stone Creek Women.

Williams makes people sit still and look at things from a different point of view, says Cindy Heidemann, general books manager at the bookstore. "She can show them things they normally wouldn't see," said Heidemann.

Her other books include *Refugee*, *Pieces of White Shell* and *Coyote's Canyon*.

When she is not writing stories, Williams is a naturalist in residence at the Utah Museum of Natural History. She teaches nature courses to children and teachers.
