

Senior trio sweeps basketball awards

Oregon seniors Missy Croshaw, Debbie Sporchich and Sara Wilson were named the women's basketball team's most valuable players for the 1993-94 season at its annual awards banquet Saturday night at the Len Casanova Athletic Center.

The trio of four-year letter winners that led the Ducks to a 20-9 record and the second round of the NCAA tournament walked away with the majority of team accolades as voted by their teammates, in addition to sharing the MVP honors.

It marked the third time in four years that Sporchich had accorded most valuable player honors, earning the tribute her freshman and junior seasons to join Stefanie Kasperski, Lauri Landerholm and Alison (Lang) Robertson as the program's only other three-time winners of the distinction.

Wilson was also chosen to receive the Harry Ritchie Scholar Award, given to the player for her athletic and academic achievements, as well as sharing the recognition as the women's

best defensive player with Sporchich. Croshaw also was the recipient of the Bev Smith Most Inspirational Player Award for the second time in three years.

Freshman Arianne Boyer, who previously was named to the Pacific-10 Conference's all-freshman team, was voted as the Ducks' most valuable newcomer, while classmate Sandie Edwards was given the Bob and Ivan Havercroft Award as the team's most improved player.

Sporchich, a first-team all-conference performer, led the Ducks

in scoring and rebounding with averages of 15.6 points and 9.1 rebounds per game. In addition, the team's three-time scoring leader became the program's first player to ever lead the squad in rebounding four years in a row.

Wilson averaged 14.2 points and 7.4 rebounds a game while leading the Pac-10 in field goal accuracy at 59.3 percent. In addition, the GTE academic all-District VII and two-time all-conference choice has accumulated a 3.44 grade-point average in psychology.

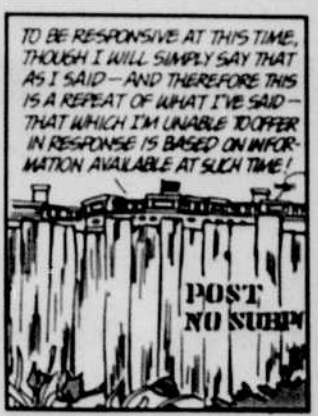
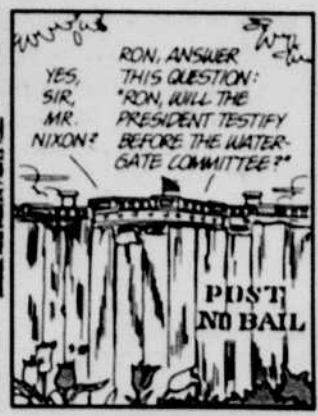
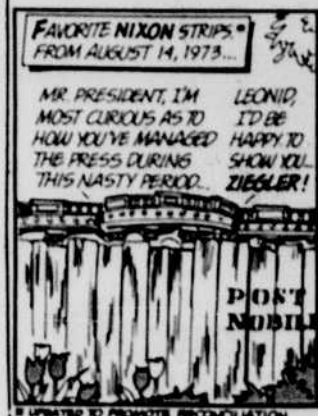
