according to the court.

The hearing for this case will
be at 2 p.m.

In Fisher v. Bowen & ASUO
Elections, Martin Fisher, a
columnist for the Emerald, is
challenging Ballot Measures 3
and 13, which students voted on
in the primary elections April
27-28.

The ballot count is currently
under a court injunction, but
Fisher wants the results invali-
dated.

This hearing will be from 2:30

p.m.

In other hearings, Fritz von
Carp alleges that Michelle Parks
defrauded the ASUO by collect-
ing a monthly stipend and
accepting Incidental Fee Com-
mittee-funded travel money
while not enrolled as a student
last fall.

Von Carp is asking the court
to direct the ASUO Executive to
issue a complaint against Parks
with the Lane County District
Attorney. That hearing will be at
3 p.m.

At 4 p.m., a hearing will invite
comment on the EMU Board of
Directors' attempt to eject board

member Stephen Conser from
the board. EMUB v. Conser con-
tends that Conser didn't main-
tain at least half-time status with
the board.

Finally at 5 p.m., the court
will have a hearing on West-
moreland Tenants' Council
President Robert Hurtado's
request for a ruling asking
whether the IFC can withhold
stipends to a student's spouse
who is serving on a tenants'
council.
