Soggy weather postpones women's golf West regional

Wet course conditions Thursday canceled the first round of the NCAA Women's Golf West Regional in Albuquerque, N.M.

Oregon is among the teams seeking a berth in the NCAA Championships May 25-28 in West Linn. The first round was

canceled because of the weather and unplayable course conditions, according to an NCAA representative at the tournament.

If the weather improves teams will play 36 holes with a shotgun start on Friday.

Basketball assistant departs

After one season at Oregon, assistant men's basketball coach Ronny Thompson has taken an assistant's job at Loyola College in Baltimore, according to a Loyola College press release.

Thompson, the son of Georgetown coach John Thompson, graduated from Georgetown in 1992 after playing for the Hoyas. He worked for Prudential Securities in New York City for a year before coming to Eugene.

But Heinonen is more concerned with qualifying a few more people for the Pac-10s.

"I'd like to see Shannon Elliot get a mark in the 1,500 and she can do that with the right kind of field," Heinonen said. "Mary Gilbert in the 100-hurdles would be another possibility. She's not that far away and she's running very well right now."

The rest of the women's meet will be sprinkled with world-class athletes, especially in the distance races. A special 1,200-meter race will feature Olympians Maria Mutola, Suzy Hamilton and PattiSue Plumer. In the 5,000, Eugene's own Annette Peters will head up the

field. Peters is the American record holder in the event. Glusac will also compete in that race.

Three of the men's team's six NCAA provisional qualifiers may run the mile in Saturday's meet. The Twilight Mile has become the marquee event of the Oregon Twilight.

Saturday's race promises to live up to its billing. Oregon's runners will take a shot at some top-flight competition and will try to reach the NCAA qualifying standard in the event.

The meet begins at 5:30 p.m. The women's final event is the 5,000, which begins at 7:55. The mile is the concluding event of the meet and is scheduled to be run at 8:15 p.m.
