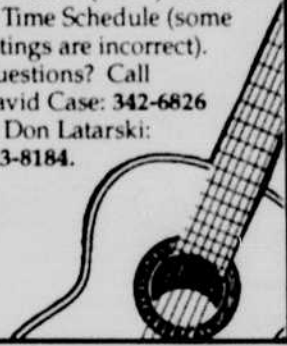

EMU Board approves document revisions

EMU Governance Document revisions were approved by the EMU Board at the full board meeting Wednesday, May 11.

The most significant change made to the document concerns the number of at-large student members elected to the EMU Board. In the future, there will be four, instead of the existing five, student members elected at-large from the student body for two-year terms. With the change, two students, instead of three, will be elected in odd-numbered years.

The same number of students will work on the EMU Board; however, the two board members appointed by the Incidental Fee Committee in the past will be replaced by three finance senators. This is a result of the

decision made in March to dissolve the IFC. "Basically all we did was to accommodate the new constitution," said Frank Geltner, the EMU Associate Director who is also a member of the EMU Board and the Governance Document Review Committee.

Because the number of at-large members has decreased by one, EMU and ASUO Program Representatives will be eligible to serve as a committee chairperson. This position has been filled only by at-large student members in the past.

Voting by proxy will no longer be allowed. "We just found out it was against state law," Geltner said.

A Parliamentary Authority amendment was added to the document. The amendment states that the EMU Board of Directors is governed by the rules contained in the

current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order."

The revised EMU Governance Document will now go to the Constitution Court for approval, according to Geltner. These changes to the governance of the EMU Board will be implemented by members of the newly elected board, who begin serving their terms at the next full board meeting on May 25.

Committee will restructure Women's Center

A committee that is restructuring the ASUO Women's Center will be in charge of hiring a new director and administrative assistant for the center.

The committee is composed of the current ASUO vice president, administrators from the Dean of Students office, representatives from student unions and other faculty and students. The committee will hold a nationwide search for a professional, full-time director.

In the past, the center received complaints that it didn't serve the needs of all women.

"We want someone who's professional and able to relate to the various problems that will occur in the center," said Erika Armsbury, a member of the restructuring committee.

The new director would aid the committee in choosing an administrative assistant and hiring a staff in the fall. The hope is that the new director and staff will change the atmosphere of the center.

"The ideal Women's Center will be one that provides services and resources," said Armsbury. "It will get past a victim's center and move to a place of empowerment. This is a place where women can feel strong, not be victims of the situation. I want women to feel that they can still receive support."

The center will provide referrals to support services throughout Eugene. It will be a place for women that will have access to equipment and resources, such as a library and information files.

"Last spring, the needs of all women weren't

being filled, especially those of women of color, nontraditional women, women with children and straight white women," said ASUO President Eric Bowen.

For restructuring, a neutral third party was brought in, headed by Debra Landforce of the Dean of Students office. This restructuring committee assessed the initial problems in the center. They decided that the problems in the center were deeper than originally suspected. It would take longer than expected to correct the problems.

"I took short-term steps in order to correct the long-term problem. I fired the director and hired a new one, Michelle Parks," Bowen said. "But her contract expires on June 30."

He said his role throughout the restructuring has been one of support. He provided administrative support and guidance and made sure deadlines were met.

"I advise that the new restructuring committee not limit themselves," Bowen said. "If there were no constraints on what services they could provide, what services would they support?"

There has been little to no opposition to the restructuring of the Women's Center.

"The reports that I received from women have all been positive," Bowen said. "I believe that most women want a center that addresses their needs. I hope this becomes a place for education and empowerment, a place to develop leadership skills, and a place where they will support each other."
