

Blair in second after first day of NCAA heptathlon

Oregon's Kelly Blair finished the first day of competition in the heptathlon 25 points out of first place at the NCAA Track and Field Championships in Boise, Idaho.

Freshman Milena Glusac finished second in her heat in the semifinals of the 3,000-meter race. Glusac started quick, but faded midway through the race. She then got her second wind to finish with a time of 9:41.74, qualifying her for the finals Friday with the seventh best time overall.

"I just wanted to qualify," Glusac said. "I just decided to go for it, but then a bunch of people passed me and I thought, 'OK, time to kick it into gear and get down to business.'"

After four events Blair has 3,502 points,

good enough for second place behind George Mason's Diane Guthrie who finished the day with 3,527 points.

Blair, the defending national champion in the heptathlon, took second in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 13.87, third in the 200 at 24.56, fourth in the high jump with a leap of 5-9 1/4 and ninth in the shot at 38-9 1/2.

Pittsburg's Najuma Fletcher is third with 3,500.

Guthrie has the top score this season in the heptathlon and finished third at last year's NCAA meet.

The heptathlon will conclude today with the long jump, javelin and 800 meters.

In other events at the meet, Hammer thrower Balazs Kiss, troubled by an in-

jured hip and in danger of not qualifying for the final, Wednesday became the first Southern Cal athlete in 26 years to win consecutive titles at the NCAA Track and Field Championships.

Alex Papadimitriou of Texas-El Paso finished second at 237-7, beating third-place finisher Roman Linscheid of St. John's by two inches.

Fifty of the 78 throws in the competition surpassed the previous stadium record of 203-1 by Rick Fritzmeier of Athletes in Action in 1984.

Meanwhile, John Godina of UCLA, who injured his right pectoral muscle this year, won the men's discus title at 198-5, the shortest winning throw since 1986. He will try for a meet double Saturday in the shot put.

Debbie Ann Parris of Louisiana State, the defending champion in the women's 400-meter hurdles, gave the Tigers a headstart toward their eighth consecutive team title, winning her semifinal in 56.60, the best time in three heats.

LSU, the two-time defending champion in the women's 400 relay, also won its heat. Anchored by Cheryl Taplin, the Tigers clocked 44.10 while Alabama, the other heat winner, was timed in 43.92.

The LSU men's 400-meter relay team, seeking its third straight NCAA title, posted a sparkling 39.00 in winning its heat and advancing into Friday's final.

Texas Christian, last year's relay relay runner-up, dropped the baton on the second handoff and did not finish.

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
