Duck guard to transfer back home

Junior guard Brion Smith will not be returning to the Oregon basketball team next year and will transfer to Wayland Baptist University in Plainview, Tex., for his senior season.

In his first year at Oregon after transferring from Cisco (Tex.) Community College, Smith played in 16 games for the Ducks, scoring 16 points, dishing out 13 assists and grabbing nine rebounds during the 1993-94 campaign.

The 6-foot-1 Houston, Tex., native scored five points each at Arizona and at Idaho for his top scoring outputs.

Cappy Mack, a member of the Oregon women's golf team, was selected as a True Temper Academic all-American Tuesday afternoon for the second time in as many years.

Mack, a senior from Portland, was one of five NCAA Division I women golfers named to the squad as selected by the College Golf Association. The psychology major carries a 3.92 grade point average.

As she maintains a high GPA, Mack's low scores

on the golf course led Oregon to a 13th-place finish at the NCAA Championships last weekend at the Oregon Golf Club.

Team captain Lee Kirner received the Most Valuable Player Award for the fourth straight year as coach Buzz Summers announced the Oregon men's tennis awards on Thursday.

Dava Partovi was given the Most Improved honors while Luke Rencher was named Hardest Worker. The Ducks had a record-breaking 23 wins to go along with nine losses this season.
