U.S. undefeated, but not victorious

The World Cup has arrived and so has the 50-1 shot United States soccer team, as they battled with Switzerland to a 1-1 tie in the first of three first round games.

The United States opener against Switzerland started out looking as if neither team would be able to put together their offense to be a threat. After 39 minutes of play, which consist-

ed of minimal scoring opportunities, the Swiss received their first real chance to score, a free kick just outside of the penalty box. The United States set up their defensive wall to cut down the amount of ground goalkeeper Tony Meola would have to cover. Everything seemed to be set to reject the Swiss scoring opportunity when Georges Bregy found the open corner of the goal to make the score 1-0.

After the goal by Switzerland many American fans thought, here we go again. At the last World Cup in 1990, the United States opened the tournament with a 5-1 loss to Czechoslovakia which set the tone for the rest of the tournament. On Saturday, with 73,425 fans on hand at the Detroit Silverdome, the United States was not about to give up.

Many thought, if the United States were to advance past the

first round they would need their stars (Thomas Dooley, John Harkes and Tab Ramos) to rise to the occasion. It was not Dooley, Harkes, or Ramos however, that looked to the stars it was newcomer Eric Wynalda. Wynalda, who had been playing ill, scored the game-tying goal. With less than a minute left in the first half, Harkes on a break, was knocked down by Ciraco Sforza 28 yards out from the goal. Ramos who takes all free kicks for the United States motioned to Wynalda to take the kick instead because he felt it was out of his range. Wynalda placed the shot where no human goalie would of been able to block it. Wynalda's shot curved around the Swiss wall and into the upper left-hand corner, flying past goaltender Marco Pascolo and hitting the bottom of the cross bar on the way in.

"That was the best shot I ever had in my life," Wynalda told a reporter for the *L.A. Times* Wire Service.

For the rest of the game, the two teams battled but neither were able to come up with a goal.

"One point for us is a great result right now," said Meola during an interview with the same *L.A. Times* reporter. "Obviously, this is a lot better (than '90). We're right in the running. We have as good a chance as any one to get through."

But....

"In a nutshell, we played badly and got a point," said Harkes in the same interview.

Next up for the United States is Colombia a team that started the tournament with 12-1 odds of winning the whole thing; but now they have fallen below the United States in the standings because they lost their opener to Romania in a 3-1 upset. The stars of Colombia are Faustino "The Octopus" Asprilla, Carlos Valderama, and Fredy Rincon. Asprilla the top player for Colombia, got the name "The Octopus" because of all the moves that he has. His ability to bolt past the defense and soar through the air has made him the Michael Jordan of soccer.

For the United States to advance to the Round of 16 they must win one of their next two games. The two teams will play on Wednesday at 4:25 p.m. on ESPN.

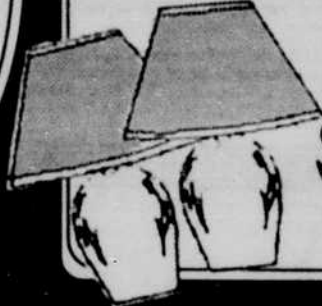

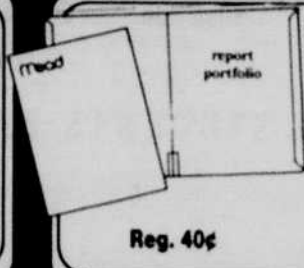

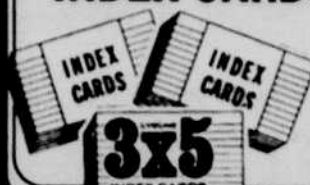
