

# Ems' win streak broken by Mariners in ninth inning

The Eugene Emerald victory train came to a halt Monday night at Civic Stadium as the Bellingham Mariners salvaged the final game of their five game series with the red-hot Ems with a 3-2 win.

Joel Ramirez's two-out infield single with the bases loaded off reliever Tim Grieve drove home the tying and winning runs for the Mariners in the top of the ninth to give the Mariners their third victory of the season.

Starting pitcher John Thompson pitched seven strong innings for the Mariners, allowing only one hit and striking out seven Emerald batters and reliever Tom Szimanski notched his first victory of the season.

Grieve, who entered the game with a .000 earned run average, suffered his first defeat to even

his season mark at 1-1.

The loss broke the Ems' seven game win streak and put their season mark at 9-3, good enough for first place in the Southern division in the Northwest League.

In the previous game on Sunday, the Ems once again came from behind to tie the Mariners in the eighth inning and relied on strong relief pitching until the bottom of the 11th inning when Sean McNally took third on a Mariner wild pitch and scored the winning run on catcher Jason Heath's errant throw that rolled into left field.

"I figured I had to get home and get it over with," said McNally. "It seemed like we were out there forever."

The Ems open up a five game series against the Everett Giants in Everett today before returning home on July 4th to take on the Boise Hawks.
