★ Active 20/30 Club Fireworks Show

Oohs and ahhs are sure to abound as the Eugene Active 20/30 Club once again puts on its annual Independence Day program at Autzen Stadium. Now in its 48th year, the show is promises the largest fireworks show in the area.

Parking lots and food vendors at Autzen will open at 4 p.m. Beginning at 5 p.m., the Stadium Plaza area (near Gate E) will host activities including line dance instruction and horse-drawn hay wagon rides. The Plaza also will offer balloons, a bounce machine and a human gyroscope.

At 7 p.m., the stadium itself will open (at Gate E). The Eugene Symphonic Band will begin a program of patriotic tunes and marches at 7:30, which will be followed at 8:30 by a program sponsored by the radio station New Country 93.

Fireworks begin at dusk (around 9:30), and are expected to last approximately 20 minutes.

The Active 20/30 Club is asking a \$5 donation for each car parked at Autzen. Proceeds will go to children's charities within Lane County. For information, call 346-1149.

★ Baseball at Civic Stadium

General admission tickets are going for \$3.50 each at Civic Stadium (2077 Willamette St.), where the Eugene Emeralds will take on the Boise Hawks in a Northwest League game on July 4. Gates open at 5:30 p.m. and the game begins at 7. A fireworks display will take place about 20 minutes after the last out. For more information, call 342-5367.

★ Eugene PRCA Rodeo

Sponsored by the Eugene Rodeo Cowboys Association, this four-day event will take place July 1-4. Shows begin at 7 p.m. Friday, 1:30 and 7:30 p.m. Saturday, 5 p.m. Sunday, and at 6 p.m. on Monday, July 4. A fireworks display will follow Monday's show.

Tickets to the rodeo cost \$7.95 for general admission, and \$9.95 and \$14.95 for reserved seats. The rodeo grounds are located on Prairie Road, two miles north of Beltline. For information, call 74-RODEO.

★ Art and the Vineyard

A benefit for the Maude Kerns Art Center, the 11th annual Art and the Vineyard Festival will offer wine tasting from a dozen local wineries, a musical program, 20 food booths and "the finest in Northwest art."

Taking place July 2-4 at Alton Baker Park near Autzen Stadium, the festival will be open from 11 a.m. to 8:30 each day. Suggested admission is \$3 for an individual, with children six and under admitted free. For information, call 345-1571.

★ Butte to Butte Run and Mayor's Walk

Another July 4 tradition — now in its 21st year — the Butte to Butte Run is the oldest and largest road race in Eugene. The race route stretches 10 kilometers from the foot of Spencer Butte at 43rd Avenue and Donald Street to Skinner Butte Park next to the Willamette River. The Mayor's Walk will occur simultaneously, and follows a slightly different route.

★ Cottage Grove Parade

Those seeking a slightly smaller town experience on the Fourth should consider the 4th annual parade in Cottage Grove, a few minutes south of Eugene on Interstate 5.

The parade will begin at 1 p.m. at the corner of Main Street and River Road, and will continue along Main Street to Coiner Park at 15th Street. At the park, there will be an old-fashioned Fourth of July picnic, featuring food and craft booths, a few words from local notables, and live entertainment from the Cottage Grove Theater Group, a 70-member Fourth of July Choir, the Tom Waters Band, singer Charlene Schneider and Glenn Wagner and His Friends. Events are expected to last until approximately 6 p.m. and Event Director Jerry Bakke promises that "a good time will be had by all."

in the Northwest.

O'Kelley's appointment as interim dean comes in a year filled with leadership changes at the University. The most prominent of these changes is Frohn-mayer's ascension to the presidency, which followed Myles Brand's decision to take a job as president of Indiana University.

The top faculty post also changed hands this year, as Norman Wessells announced that he would step down from his position as provost. He will be replaced by John T. Moseley, who had been serving as the University's vice president for research.

And the schools of business and journalism will both operate under new heads next year, as the deans at both schools have decided to pursue other activities at the University.

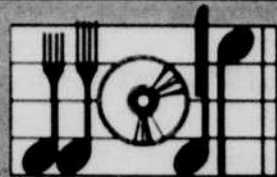
