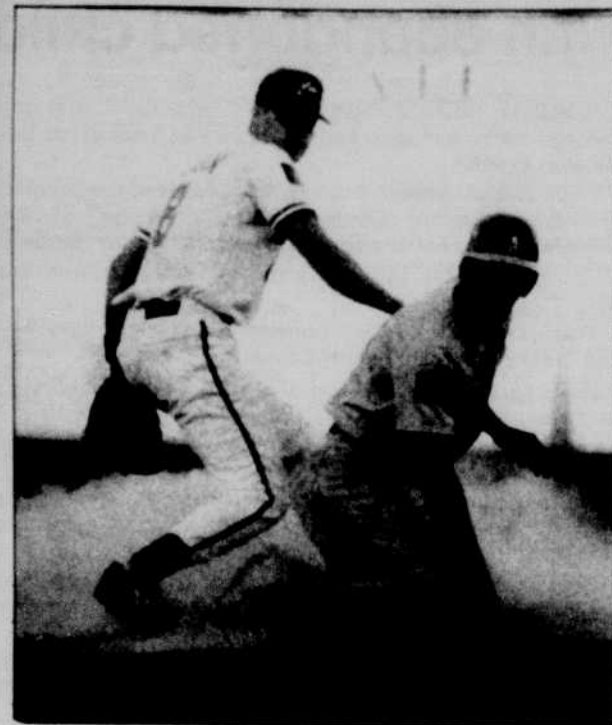

Southern Oregon's 10th inning barrage sinks Ems

Things don't always go as planned.

The Eugene Emeralds found this out the hard way Monday night against the visiting Southern Oregon A's at Civic Stadium. Southern Oregon came up with seven runs in the top of the tenth to overtake the Ems and post an 11-4 victory.

The A's took advantage of two costly Emerald errors and pounded out five hits in the 10th, including Ben Grieve's two-run home run, to give the A's their 14th win of the season.

Chris Cochrane picked up his

first victory for the A's and now stands at 1-4 on the year.

Emerald reliever Mike Kurnik was the recipient of the 10th inning damage and suffered the loss to even his mark at 1-1.

Eugene started off the scoring early on Donovan Delaney's first inning sacrifice that scored Brian Teeters, who led off the bottom of the first with a walk.

Southern Oregon answered in the second with three runs. Third baseman Mike Stamison doubled, scoring John Jones, and two batters later, catcher Leonardo Ventura singled, scoring Grieve and Stamison.

The pitching and defense took

over in the middle innings. Emerald starter Eric Mooney struck out the side in the third inning and Javier Gamboa came on in the fifth and retired the first nine batters that he faced. Mooney and Gamboa combined for 12 strikeouts over nine innings.

The defensive highlight of the night came from Delaney in right field. Delaney caught up to a Jose Soriano liner and fired a strike to first baseman Malcolm Cepeda, catching Ventura off the base to complete the rare double play.

A's starter Brian Domenico pitched five innings, narrowly surviving a fourth inning rally that was ended as Emerald sec-

ond baseman Jed Hansen lined one back up the box, where it struck Domenico's foot, allowing him enough time to toss it over to first to end the inning.

The Ems woke up in the seventh with a two-out rally that produced the two runs that tied the game. After Paul Vindivich reached base on a fielders' choice, pinch hitter Sean McNally doubled him home. Center fielder Brian Teeters followed with a double of his own, scoring McNally and tying the game.

Southern Oregon's shortstop Mike Moschetti silenced the Civic Stadium crowd with a towering home run in the ninth that

gave the A's a 4-3 lead. The shot was Moschetti's first and gave him only his fifth RBI for the year.

The crowd came to life again in the Ems' half of the ninth as Teeters singled home Cepeda, who led off with a walk. Teeters then ended the inning trying to steal second base, which would have put him in scoring position.

"He (Teeters) tried to force it a little bit and make something happen," said Eugene manager Brian Poldberg. "He got a little antsy."

The Ems and A's will conclude their short, two-game series tonight at 7:00 at Civic Stadium.
