

Softball team staff adds two coaches

Two former all-league standouts in the Pacific-10 conference have joined University softball coach Tami Brown's staff, the school announced Wednesday.

Angie Jacobs, who played first base for California (1985-1989), and former Arizona State pitcher Terri Carnicelli Smith (1989-1992) will help guide the Ducks during the 1995 season.

Jacobs was all-conference in 1989 at California, where she earned her bachelor's degree in psychology. A two-time all-American in the Amateur Softball Association and a teammate of Brown's with the Redding Rebels, she helped the Rebels capture back-to-back national championships in the past two summers.

She played softball internationally and helped the Golden Bears place third at the NCAA College World Series in 1986.

Jacobs was an assistant coach at San Jose State the past two years after earning her master's degree in sports psychology at John F. Kennedy University in Orinda, Calif.

Smith received her undergraduate degree from Arizona State in 1993, majoring in therapeutic recreation. She was a volunteer coach last spring with the Ducks.

Jacobs replaces Ces Coulson as the full-time assistant coach and Smith takes over for Nikki Busch as the restricted earnings staff member.

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Indiana Pacer's coach Larry Brown will be the featured speaker at the University Basketball Coach's clinic, scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 29 at McArthur Court.

Brown has had only one losing season in his 21-year coaching career, which includes three NCAA Final Four appearances and a national championship in 1988 at Kansas. In addition to a successful run as an NBA coach, he has been named American Basketball Association Coach of the Year three times.

The Ducks lost more than a game and the match in the third game—they lost sophomore outside hitter Amy McNeel to a twisted ankle.

With the Ducks leading 13-9 and the Beavers serving, McNeel came up with a smashing kill down the left side for a side out. On the ensuing play, Oregon State senior outside hitter received a poor set close to the net and tracked it down—carrying herself under the net. With Smith still on the Ducks' side of the court, McNeel went up for a ball and twisted her ankle as she came down on Smith's foot.

Gregory was unable to speculate on McNeel's injury but did say that he thought she would be out for some time.

"Amy had a great game," said Gregory. "Her injury was unfortunate. We were put in a difficult situation with her out and no more left-side hitters on the bench. We had no other choice than to go with Casey Crisler, who has never played that position before."

Oregon State out-hit the Ducks .236 to .167 and

came up with 14 more kills and sets than Oregon. The Beavers had 7 service aces to the Ducks 1. Oregon State also came up with 8 more digs and 2 more total team blocks than Oregon.

The Beavers' offense was paced by the hard-hitting of Smith and sophomore Rachel Hochgesang with 17 and 11 kills respectively.

"I was pleased to see us compete hard," said Gregory, "but we didn't perform as well as we needed to to help us win. (Oregon State) has five good hitters that make it difficult."

The Ducks were led offensively by sophomore Bettina Roth who hit .400 and had 8 kills. Senior co-captain Angee Henderson chipped in with 8 kills and 13 digs. McNeel led the team defensively with 18 digs while also hitting .300 with 7 kills. Senior co-captain LaReina Woods came up with the defensive plays of the night on her way to 16 digs while sophomore Anna Gomez tumbled all over the court to earn her 27 sets.

The match against Oregon State will be rebroadcast on Prime Sports Northwest at 9 tonight on TCI Cable channel 23.

Oregon's next match is Friday at 7:05 p.m. in Mac Court as it plays host to Cal State Northridge.
