

Journalism school shows its pride

It was an afternoon of celebration for the School of Journalism and Communication Thursday and new dean Duncan McDonald was the center of attention.

McDonald spoke to a crowd of approximately 250 people welcoming them to a new year. He said he wanted students to know, "We are all partners in their education. It is a two-way street."

He stressed the importance of getting to know faculty members and said that relationships between faculty and students should extend beyond graduation. McDonald said in the past week, he had been in touch with 12 graduates.

He also encouraged students to participate in work outside of the classroom. He said that adding a competitive edge to their education is worth it.

A former professor of the school, McDonald left in 1992 to head the Freedom Forum Media Studies Center at Columbia University in New York. He returned to the University to become the 11th dean of the School of Journalism and Communication.

McDonald replaces Arnold Ismach, who is now teaching as a professor.

"I would not have come back from New York if I didn't think this was one of the best Journalism schools in the nation," McDonald said. He said specifically that the faculty is an asset to the school.

Many professors in the journalism school were in attendance during the Convocation and available to talk to students over refreshments.

"We are accessible and we should be taken advantage of," Greg Kerber, assistant dean of the School of Journalism, said of the faculty.

Students in attendance seemed pleased with the journalism school. Eric Franks, the vice president of the University's chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists, believes that the school is becoming a friendlier environment, especially for transfer students in core classes.

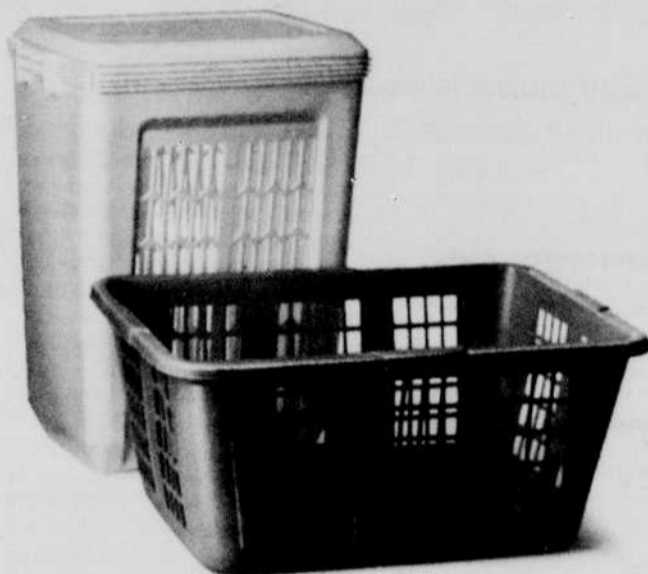
