VISITING PROFESSORSHIP IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND PEACE

The committee that selects the distinguished Carlton Raymond and Wilberta Ripley Savage Professor in International Relations and Peace is pleased to announce an opening for a Graduate Teaching Fellow (GTF) to assist the 1994-95 Savage Professor, Dimitrina Petrova. She has been a Member of Parliament in Bulgaria since June 1990 representing the environmental movement ECOGLASNOST (the most active opposition organization in Bulgaria during the last year of communist rule), and she is one of the founding members of the Union of Democratic Forces. Petrova is a Professor of Philosophy at the Kliment Ohridski University of Sofia and currently is involved in starting a women's studies project at Bulgaria's Center for the Study of Democracy.

The GTF will assist Professor Petrova in teaching two courses during the spring term of 1995, consisting of a large undergraduate class and a smaller graduate seminar. The GTF will also work with the Savage Professorship Committee and its chair during winter term 1995 to prepare for the spring. The GTF position may be appointed at .20 FTE for the winter, .40 for the spring, and a possible .20 for the summer.

To qualify, candidates should be enrolled as a full-time graduate student at the UO in a field related to Professor Petrova's expertise; should have a strong interest in issues related to human rights, environmental studies, and women's studies; and should possess strong cross-cultural communication, organization, and writing skills. Applicants should submit a current visa, two letters of reference, and a short essay indicating why they would like to work with Professor Petrova. Applications should be submitted to the Office of International Affairs, 221 Johnson Hall (attention: Susan Plass, phone: 346-2166) no later than 5:00 p.m. on December 2, 1994.
