Oregon quarterback Danny O'Neil said.

Well, go they are. But the celebration will be short-lived as the Ducks now have just more than a month to prepare for the ever-dangerous Penn State Nittany Lions and their potential undefeated season.

Oregon last met Penn State in postseason action in the 1960 Liberty Bowl. The Lions walloped the Ducks 41-12 in that game and many believe that this year's version of the Ducks versus the Lions is a modern-day David versus Goliath.

Just ask ESPN analyst Beano Cook.

"Penn State is playing a nobody in the Rose Bowl," Cook said. "I mean Penn State is going to beat Oregon. It may be by two touchdowns or four touchdowns, but they're going to beat them."

When Oregon's season is spoken of, words like "Cinderella story" and "improbable" are often used, usually words that suggest a lack of respect. The Ducks are ranked 12th in this week's Associated Press poll, yet they will go in to the Rose Bowl a decided underdog against the Big Ten champions, and the Lions could quite possibly be playing for a national championship.

Nonetheless, Duck fans and players can celebrate their hard-fought Pac-10 title, and finally, they can say "Rose Bowl" without any superstitious repercussions or misfortunes.

"This is the best feeling right here," Oregon receiver Cristin McLemore said following Saturday's clinching game. "The feeling that you have, you can never ask for anything sweeter."

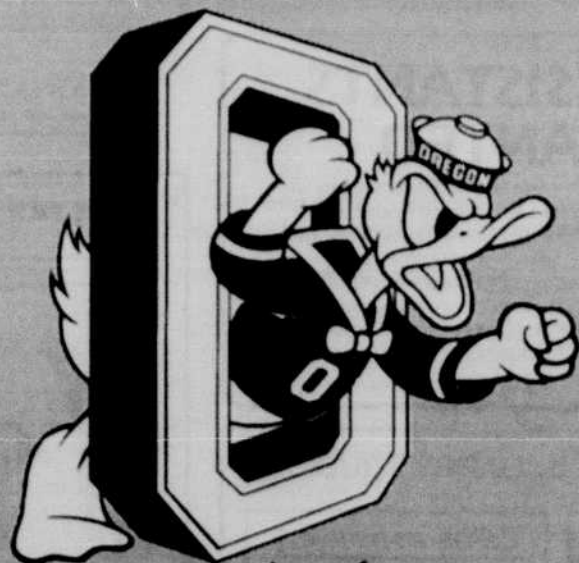
