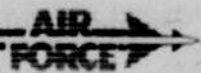

Duck runners compete in NCAAs

Men's representative Matt Davis and the women's cross country team will compete at the NCAA Cross Country Championships Monday in Fayetteville, Ark.

Davis, a freshman, was the sole representative of the men's meet. He didn't run track last spring because of a knee injury, and according to coach Bill Dellinger he was still hindered by the injury at the start of the season. But solid performances contributed to Davis' progress, and eventually to his fifth place finish at the Pacific-10 championships and his seventh place finish at the District 8 meet.

"I thought his progress throughout the year was very good," Dellinger said. "I'm really happy for him. This is going to be a very good experience for

him."

In every meet this year, Davis has improved his performance from the previous race. He placed 18th in the Mountain West Classic, ninth in the Jeff Drenth Memorial, and finished fifth in the Pac-10 meet, which Davis believes was his best performance.

"That was the first race on the college level that I felt like I raced," Davis said.

Milena Glusac lead the women to the at-large selection with a first place finish at the District meet.

"I'm really pleased with my last performance. I think that's really going to help me in going to the NCAA's," Glusac said. She said she was pleased with the team's chances at Monday's meet.

"I think we have a really good chance, because when we ran last week, we took third and we

weren't at full strength. I think it's going to be a really good race."

"As of (Thursday's practice), they were all healthy, except of course for Melody's injury," coach Tom Heinonen said.

Fairchild's sore hip, which was aggravated at the Pac-10 championships, kept her from practicing last week, but Heinonen said she will run today.

"Her injury just appears to require rest," Heinonen said.

The team finished eighth at last year's meet, and Glusac was optimistic about the situation that the team is in this year.

"Last year, we went in and we beat the team that won the Pac-10 championships," Glusac said. "We know that we can run better, and so we are just going to take the opportunity that was given to us to show that we do deserve to be there."


Oregon wrestlers off to good start

The Oregon Duck wrestling team took six of ten weight classes at the 1994 Southern Oregon Open on Saturday.

Jeremy Ensrud, a redshirt freshman, was the tournament's champion in the 126-pound weight class and was named the tournament's outstanding wrestler. The Ducks also got first place finishes from junior Kevin Roberts, who is ranked second in the Pacific-10 in the 118-pound weight class, and Cory Sonnen, last year's champion in the 142-pound weight class, as well as

from sophomore Scott Norton (150), junior Peter Stayner (158), and senior Mat Sprague (167).

The team also announced on Friday that they have signed two prep wrestlers from Spokane in letters of intent. Troy Hughes, who is a two-time state finalist from Meade High School, wrestles around the 177-pound weight class, and Dusty Roberts, who wrestles in the 142-pound weight class and hails from Spokane's University High School, is the younger brother of Oregon's Kevin Roberts.
