Deady renovations almost complete after 118 years

Facelift: Architecture students have been working with the Physical Plant to complete work on the Historic Landmark

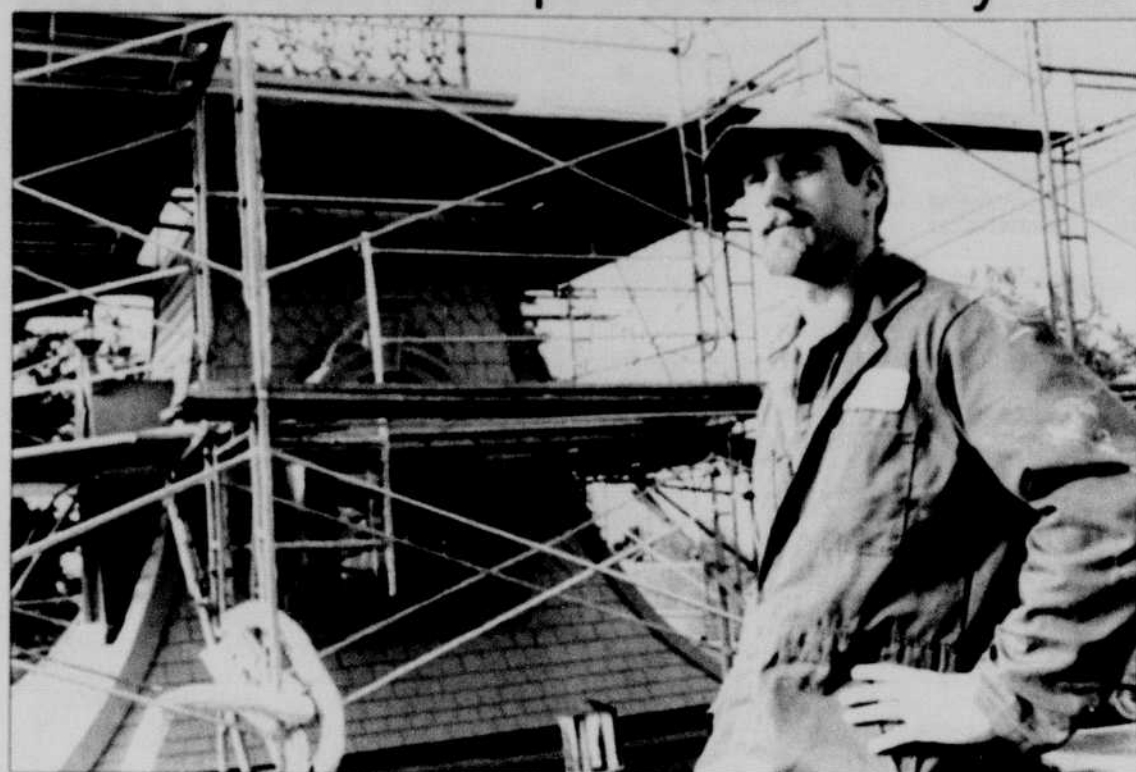
After 118 years, Deady Hall is undergoing a "facelift" this year from University students majoring in architecture.

Through an on-going restoration process, the architecture students are developing practical skills to further enhance their study of historic preservation through the architecture department.

"When you look around the United States, there aren't many people willing to allow students to participate in an important project like this," said Donald Petting, Historic Preservation Program director and associate dean of the School of Architecture. "Our Historic Preservation Program, which prepares graduates primarily to be preservation consultants or administrators, is fairly unique in incorporating that hands-on aspect."

The architecture students involved in the restoration of Deady Hall are particularly fortunate to be involved in the project. The only other structure of comparable significance in Lane County is Villard Hall, directly north of Deady on the University campus.

Villard Hall was built 11 years after Deady Hall and students have been working on parts of its restoration for more than five years now. Due to a lack of detailed drawings, blueprints, and material evidence for the details on the original buildings, the restoration of both buildings has forced the students to rely on old photographs obtained from the University Archives to match the missing ornamentation and to make the structural renovations.

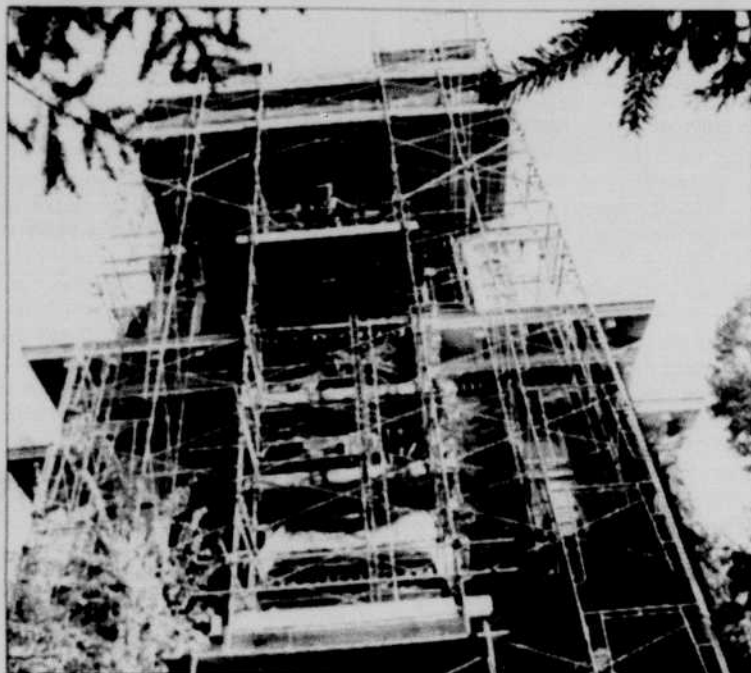

The students are under the instruction of University Physical Plant project manager James Wentworth, who has provided hands-on experience to the students with an architectural background and interest in historic preservation.

Some of the students working on the project said they decided to contribute in the facelift process of Deady Hall to gain experience in areas they had not studied before. Yet for others, like project supervisor Jonathan Smith, it is an extension of the skills already learned through studying architecture at the University.

"I've learned a lot from the carpenters and metal smiths," said Smith, a historic preservation graduate student in the School of Architecture. "This is where the trades people and the students come together and they can learn from each other."
